The Epic Fail of Arturo Zamora by Pablo Cartaya

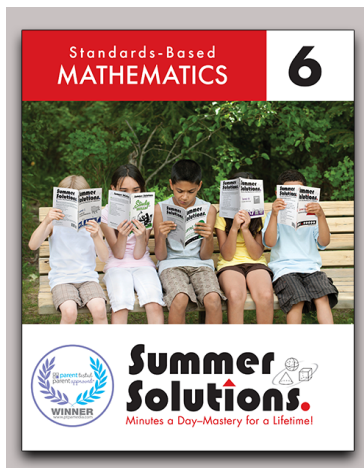
The Science of Breakable Things by Tae Keller
