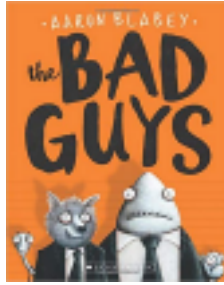

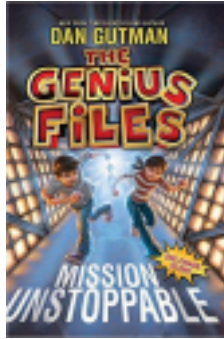

Mistakes Were Made

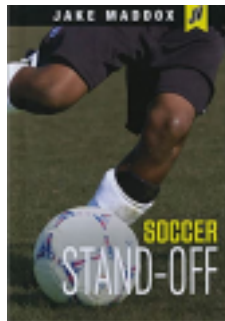

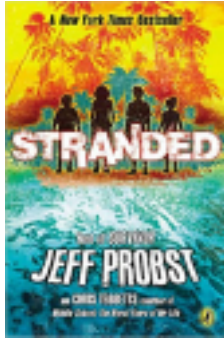
The Last Kids On Earth
