
Backyard Wildlife Habitat!

Tristyn Baggett and Maggie Meyers were awarded all tournament, and Maya Griffin awarded most valuable player!! Congratulations!







Day 1: The annual Planting for Protection Dune Restoration was a success! We are grateful that

@gulf state park and @dunedoctores partner with us to provide this amazing service and sustainability-focused learning opportunity for our students! Students (including 170 fifth graders

and 35 high and middle schools mentors) and teachers from all three district schools were on the beach planting over 3000 native plants to restore the dunes to the west of Gulf State Park Pier. Prior to planting, students will attend a rotation of onbeach classes (Coastal Dunes, Native Dune Vegetation, and Coastal Wildlife0 taught by experts, Kelly Reetz, Frederique Beroset, and William (Bill) Lynn. Special thanks to partner, Gulf Coast RC&D, for funding this and several other sustainabilityrelated projects.

Day 2: What an amazing day! Planting for Protection was a huge success! We had over 200 students from Gulf Shores City Schools participate in this dune restoration designed to help promote coastal resilience, and raise the next generation of coastal stewards.
