2022 STAAR RESULTS

ECHS STUDENTS

- Algebra I - 10 took the test; 6 passed- **60% successful**
(Approaches = 6 students, Did not meet = 4 students)
- English I - 23 took the test; 20 passed - **87% successful**
(Approaches= 6 students, Meets= 9 students, Masters = 5 students, Did not meet = 3 students)
- Biology - 24 took the test; 22 passed- **92% Successful**
(Approaches= 9 students, Meets= 9 students, Masters = 4 students, Did not meet = 2 students)
- English II- 26 took the test; 25 passed- **96% Successful**
(Approaches= 1 students, Meets= 14 students, Masters = 9 students, Did not meet = 1 students)
- US History- 18 took the test; 17 passed - **94% successful**
(Approaches= 3 students, Meets= 5 students, Masters = 9 students, Did not meet = 1 student)

LOOKING TOWARD THE FUTURE

2022-2023

- Additional Freshmen cohort of 30 students - Fall 2022
- Total of 96 students in ECHS
- Four cohorts of students (9th -12th grade)
- Our first cohort of ECHS students will graduate Spring 2023

2023-2024

- Adding more opportunities & programs for students to become college and career ready upon graduation
- The goal is to have 60% or more of our student population participating in dual enrollment courses (ECHS and Dual Credit)
