WHAT IS POTEET EARLY COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL?

- ★ Established in the 2019-2020
- ★ Partnerships with Palo Alto College
- ★ Potential to earn up to 60 college credit hours and an associate degree prior to high school graduation
- ★ Families incur no cost for their student's participation
(courses, transportation, books or fees....)



BENEFITS OF ECHS

- ★ Saves families approximately \$24,000 in college expenses
- ★ Prepares students for high skill, high wage, and high demand employment after graduation
 - ★ Improves High School Graduation Rates
 - ★ Increases the likelihood of students obtaining a college degree
 - ★ Each course has a proctor monitoring student grades and progress
 - ★ Each student is assigned a MacBook
 - ★ High School staff assists with tutoring and mentoring students

TARGETED POPULATION

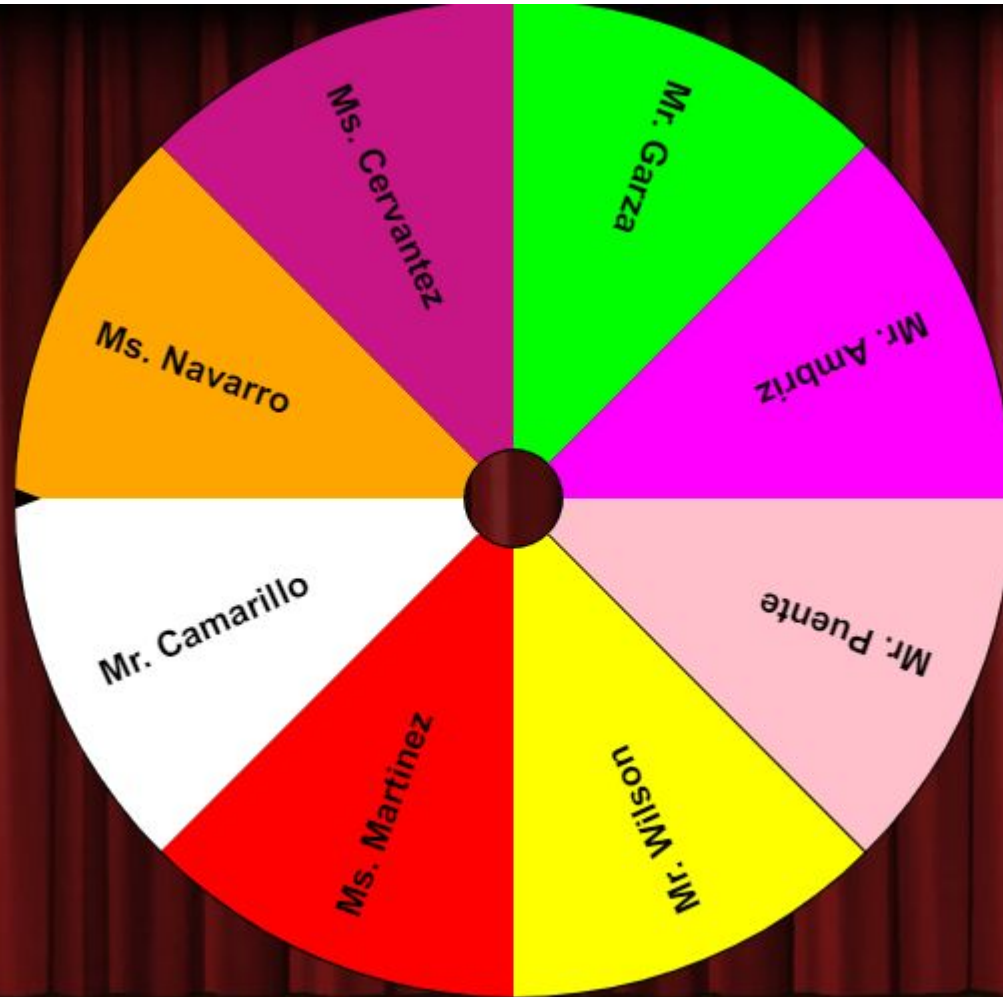
Guidelines Established by The Texas Education Agency (TEA)

- ★ At Risk of Dropping Out - 14 indicators
- ★ Enroll students historically underserved (at-risk and economically disadvantaged)
- ★ 1st Generation College Student
- ★ Enrollment of target populations should be representative of district demographics.

How Are Students Selected for the Program?

- ★ Students submit their application and essays
- ★ All students are entered into a random selection process
- ★ 25 students are randomly selected and we select 5 students from the remaining students. Those 5 are economically disadvantaged and at risk for dropping out based on PEIMS coding.

POTEET ECCHS DEMOGRAPHICS

- ★ Enrollment: 44 Students
 - Freshmen: 26 Students, Sophomores: 18 Students
- ★ Economically Disadvantaged:
 - District: 61% ECCHS: 71%
- ★ At Risk for Dropping Out (PIEMS):
 - District: 63% ECCHS: 60%
- ★ Hispanic: District 88%, ECCHS 82%
- ★ White: District 11%, ECCHS 16%
- ★ Other: District 1%, ECCHS 2%
- ★ 1st Generation College: ECCHS 82%

HOW IS OUR PROGRAM DOING?

2019–2020

- ★ Started our program with 23 Freshmen Students
- ★ Planning Year Application was submitted to TEA in November 2019 and approved in February 2020.
- ★ First Face-to-Face course– January 22, 2020
- ★ Zoom classes at PAC after Spring Break
- ★ 100% passed their first college course

2020–2021

- ★ Freshmen and Sophomore Cohort (46 students)
- ★ Designation Application was submitted to TEA in January 2021
- ★ Virtual courses due to PAC staff working remotely
- ★ Freshmen Course– Music 1306 (Spring 2021 Semester)
- ★ Sophomore Courses – EDUC 1300 & SPCH 1315 (Fall 2020)

TSI DATA

Texas Success Initiative Assessment 2.0 (TSIA2)

- ★ Series of placement tests that determine if the student is ready for college-level courses in the areas of reading, writing, and math.
- ★ We administer the test on campus and the students are provided their results immediately after they finish their test.
- ★ Learning Locator Code (LLC)- if the student scored below one or more college readiness benchmarks, their score report will include a Learning Locator Code which gives them free access to TSIA2 learning resources.
- ★ TSI Tutorials- students attend tutorials with teachers on campus during the school day

26 students enrolled in ECHS

11-need to pass ELAR all

3- need to pass the multiple choice portion of the ELAR test

2- need to pass the essay portion of the test

LOOKING TOWARD THE FUTURE

2021-2022

- ★ Adding an additional Freshmen cohort of 30 students
- ★ Approximately 80 students total for ECHS
- ★ Three cohorts of students: (9th-11th grade)

2022-2023

- ★ Additional Freshmen cohort of 30 students
- ★ Total of 110 students in ECHS
- ★ Four cohorts of students (9th -12th grade)
- ★ Our first cohort of ECHS students will graduate

2023-2024

- ★ Adding more opportunities & programs for students to become career ready
- ★ Approximately 50% of our student population will be participating in dual enrollment courses
