Leyden Breaks Ground on Historic Construction Project

May 18, it was a beautiful day; a perfect day for a groundbreaking ceremony. The event marked "the beginning of a historic construction project that will benefit generations of Leyden students," said Superintendent Nick Polyak at the start of the ceremony. "We're very excited about the construction projects that will enhance the education process for students at both campuses."

Future and current students, school board members, administrators, staff, and community members witnessed the start of the project as local elementary students donned hard hats and joined current Leyden students to break ground together – a gesture that signified the district's foresight.

"These projects are looking ahead to the future, so it is important for us to recognize the impact they will have on our local elementary students when they come to Leyden," Polyak said.

The plans include an estimated \$55 million project at East Leyden and an estimated \$25 million project at the West campus. Construction is going forward without the need for a tax referendum, Polyak noted.

Construction at the West campus began on May 25, one day after school ended for the summer. The plan features

an addition inside part of the inner courtyard. The first floor will include a cafeteria/commons area and kitchen renovation. The second floor addition will contain a new library and media center. Renovated classrooms and office areas also are part of the project.

At East, plans include new classrooms, practice rooms for band and choir, a new cafeteria/commons, an enclosed inner courtyard, aquatic center, preschool, and

daycare facility. Work at the East campus is scheduled to begin during the next school year.

"This is a massive multi-year project," Polyak said. "I want to thank our current students and staff for their patience as we work around the construction for the next two years.

"The end result will be worth it, and it will provide opportunities for generations of Leyden Eagles," he added.

Loyal Eagles Honored

Rosemont residents Ed and Mary Balogh were recently honored as this year's recipients of Leyden's Loyal Eagle Award. The couple was selected on the basis of their 12 years of enthusiastic volunteer service to the East Leyden Concert Band.

The district's music department chair Bryan Miller nominated the Baloghs by submitting their names to the Loyal Eagle Award committee members who made the selection. Miller spoke about and presented the Baloghs with the award at the April 27 Board meeting held at the East campus.

The Baloghs have four grown children – all of them attended East Leyden and played in the band. "Ed and Mary are dedicated and engaged parents," Miller said during the award presentation. "They not only attended virtually every concert, parade, festival performance, and home game but led a team of volunteers who also provided support."

Ed Balogh volunteered his services as a carpenter, constructing platforms for performances during home football games. Mary Balogh helped with the band costumes. Every other year the pair chaperoned

band members on the bus trip to Disney World in Orlando, Florida, where Leyden students performed numerous times.

In addition, Ed Balogh helped the band with equipment and performance space when he worked at the Donald E. Stephens Convention Center in Rosemont. One especially memorable contribution was the donation of lights from the convention center.

Miller noted that, "Ed's kindness ultimately resulted in a near \$100,000 lighting donation which has impacted almost every concert, dance, drama, and assembly event ever since – and will for the foreseeable future."

Sports Highlights

Baseball

Eagles baseball had an outstanding season that ended at 22-7-2. The team clinched the West Suburban Gold Championship for the first time since 2011 with a 12-7 win at Downers Grove South. Leyden had six All-Conference players, and Michael Wilms was the first player in Leyden's history to be named Conference Pitcher of the Year.

Softball

Leyden softball finished the season at 21-9-1, placing 2nd in the West Suburban Gold Conference with an 8-4 record, and winning the St. Ignatius Regional Championship held at UIC. The team had four All-Conference players and six All-Conference All-Academic Student Athletes. Two players signed letters of intent to play college softball.

Boys Volleyball

The volleyball team finished the season at 18-15, tied for 2nd place in the West Suburban Gold Division, with a 4-2 record, won the Regional Championship for the first time since 2012, and took 1st place at the Eagle Invite. Teammates Mike Motyka and Robert Elem were named to the All-Conference team, and Motyka also was named the Daily Herald All-Area Player of the Year. Roman Sydorchuk earned an All-Area Honorable Mention.
