CLASS TITLE: SUMMER CAMP TEACHER

BASIC FUNCTION:

Under the direction of the District Administrator of Expanded Learning, Summer Camp Teacher is responsible for the day-to-day management and instruction of student campers in their assignment; self-starter; manages class within assigned instructional rotations; passionate and enthusiastic about science content.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES:

ESSENTIAL DUTIES:

Maintains a warm and positive classroom environment, while establishing and managing positive behavior guidelines effectively.

Teach age-appropriate lesson plans to satisfy individual/group needs while leading camp activities in various skill levels.

Uses a variety of teaching methods that enhance science subject matter for campers.

Supports campers and camp colleagues on a continual basis.

Communicates frequently with the Coordinator and the Administrator of Expanded Learning regarding camp updates, needs, and concerns.

Cares for and protects the safety of the campers and is versed in emergency and disaster procedures.

Demonstrates ability to work with a diverse student population including students from all schools in the Dinuba Unified School District.

Perform related duties as assigned.

Current best practices appropriate to elementary school learners.

Providing a collaborative work style.

Personal characteristics: passion for working with children, optimism, flexibility, patience, joyfulness, and a sense of humor.

Commitment to using culturally competent teaching practices and science curricula that represents diversity, equity, and inclusion.

Arrive on campus promptly and remain with students during camp hours.

Promptly notify administration if absences are required and write substitute plans if needed.

ABILITY TO:

Teach learners of various age groups

Accept guidance and supervision from Summer Camp Classified Instructional Aides

Observe camper behavior, assess its appropriateness, and guide/implement appropriate behavior management techniques using Positive Discipline techniques

Willingness to appropriately identify and respond to any emergency

Seeing to read a variety of materials and monitor students.
