1. Introduction

Prior Park Schools (PPS) is a family of Christian schools based in Bath and Gibraltar. Prior Park College (PPC) and The Paragon School (TP) are incorporated in England as Prior Park Educational Trust Ltd. Prior Park School Gibraltar (PPSG), is incorporated in Gibraltar as Prior Park School Ltd. Both are companies limited by guarantee and registered charities.

The Prior Park Schools mission, underpinned by shared values, is to steward a thriving family of communities with love for the young people they serve at their heart. These vibrant communities cultivate creativity, foster integrity, and transform lives.

This recognises the specifically Catholic Christian nature of the College, whose motto ‘Deo duce, Deo luce’ (God our guide, God our light) sets the love of God as central to our school.

2. Policy Statement

First Aid is the immediate and temporary care given in the case of an injury or health emergency until the services of a medical practitioner can be obtained where necessary.

The objective of First Aid is to give help as soon as practicable to students, staff, or visitors, who are injured or suddenly taken ill before expert help arrives.

The principal aims are to save life or limbs, help recovery, and prevent a deterioration in the individual's condition.

3. First Aid provision

First Aid is available for all students, staff and visitors to PPC.

Students primarily receive first aid at the Health & Wellbeing Centre (H&WBC) from the school health team, while staff receive first aid at point of need or at the designated first aid locations from a qualified first aider as per the list of roles/staff found at the first aid locations around the school or they can self-administer first aid using the kits.

Staff and visitors can receive first aid from qualified first aiders and the HWBC at PPC when life or limb threatening.

3.1 First aid for students at PPC

Arrangements

- First aid for students is provided by the PPC H&WBC which is staffed during the school day by the health team. The hours of operation are Monday to Friday 08:00 - 18:00.
- During opening hours, a student can attend the H&WBC for assessment and treatment of their injury or condition.
- In the event of an accident where the student cannot be moved, the health team should be informed immediately (Tel: 01225 831019, ext 219 or mobile 07584 016034)
- Boarding students, first aid provision is provided in the boarding houses outside of opening hours.
- At weekends, first aid for sport fixtures is provided by an external ambulance agency.

3.2 First Aid for staff and visitors at PPC

Arrangements

- First aid is provided for staff and visitors via the qualified first aiders and the first aid kits found in designated areas within PPC as found in Appendix I.
- Staff can access all the kits.
- When a kit is located behind a locked door their staff pass will gain them access.
- Emergency pain relief medication is available for staff in the Staff Common Room first aid kit and Staff Work Room (behind reception), staff can use this when their personal supply is not available.
- Visitors will have first aid provided by the qualified first aiders who will utilise the first aid kit as necessary.
- Should further care be required beyond that which a first aider can deliver, arrangements should be made to get them to definitive care.
- Personal transport, a taxi or public transport can be used as necessary to reach definitive care.
- In life or limb threatening circumstances a nearby first aider should attend, help should simultaneously be sought from the H&WBC staff and an ambulance should be called.

4. Supplies

- First Aid kits are in designated areas within PPC, see Appendix I.
- First aid kit contents as per kit list stored in H&WBC Team online.
- Heads of Department where a first aid kit is stored are to appoint custodians.
- First aid kit custodians must check the contents monthly and arrange with the H&WBC staff to replenish the kits as necessary.
- It is the responsibility of each member of staff to familiarise themselves with the College's First Aid Policy.

5. Reporting of Accidents and Incidents

- Accidents, injuries and near misses should be reported within 24hours via the Accident and Near Miss recording form.
- Any first aid given should also be recorded on the Accident and Near Miss recording form.

6. First Aid Emergency Situations

6.1 Step by Step

Danger: check for potential danger to yourself and the casualty, make the area safe for all parties.

Response: check for a response from the casualty, 1. Shout, 2. Touch, 3 Safe painful stimuli, 4. Call for help

Catastrophic bleeding: action to stop any catastrophic bleeding.

Airway: Check and open the airway

Breathing: check for breathing 10 seconds,
If child not breathing give 5 rescue breaths, then move to C,
If adult not breathing move to C,
If adult not breathing from a drowning situation give 5 rescue breaths, then move to C.

Circulation: Check for signs of life, if no signs of life start CPR → child 15:2 adult 30:2 (compressions to breaths)

6.2 Calling for help

- Call for help from students or staff nearby who can assist you or take over.
- Arrange for someone to call 999, ask for an ambulance, state location and casualty details.
- Arrange for someone to call the H&WBC, tell them the location. They will bring a comprehensive grab bag, oxygen and defib if needed.

6.3 Severe Allergies

- Students who have a known severe allergy must carry at least one Auto Adrenaline Injector (AAI) to treat anaphylactic shock.
- Staff who have a known severe allergy should carry two AAI.
- There are AAI kept in the following locations:
 - H&WBC on a shelf opposite the second treatment room.
 - The canteen office.
 - Sports centre - on a shelf to the left outside the reception desk.
 - Behind reception.
- **Day students:** It is the parent or guardians' responsibility to provide AAI for their child.
- **Boarding students:** It is the parent or guardians' responsibility to provide AAI for their child prior to their arrival at PPC at which point it becomes the responsibility of the H&WBC alongside the Schools Medical Officer (SMO).
- All staff are trained how to use AAI Pens annually.

6.4 Asthma

- Students with Asthma diagnosis should carry their required medication with them throughout the school day.
- **Day students:** it is the parent or guardians' responsibility to ensure that students have their inhalers with them.

- **Boarding students:** It is the parent or guardians' responsibility to provide medication for their child prior to their arrival at PPC at which point it becomes the responsibility of the H&WBC alongside the SMO.

6.5 Cardiac arrest

- A casualty that is unresponsive and not breathing indicates a cardiac arrest.
- Defibrillators are available from outside the H&WBC and outside the Bury Sports centre.
- Signs are placed around the school to indicate which defibrillator is the closest.
- Staff are trained in the use of defibrillators annually.
- When required turn on the defibrillator and follow the audio prompts from the defibrillator.
- Defibrillators are checked according to the contract with SWAST.

7. First Aid Training

- Designated staff roles are trained and qualified to provide first aid, please see Appendix II.
- All first aid training is contracted into the school to ensure consistency and compliance with current practice.
- Annual training provided by the Lead Nurse to all student facing staff includes the use of:
 - AAI
 - Spill kit
 - Defibrillator
