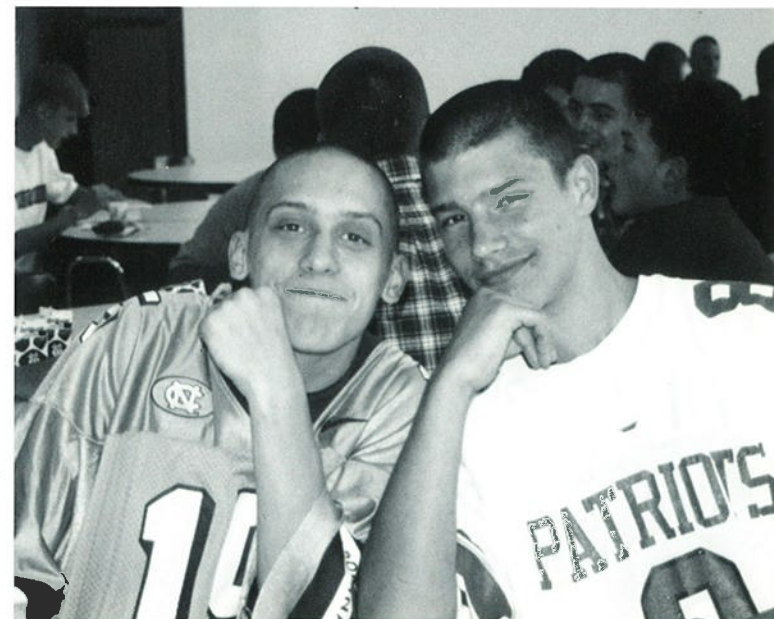
FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

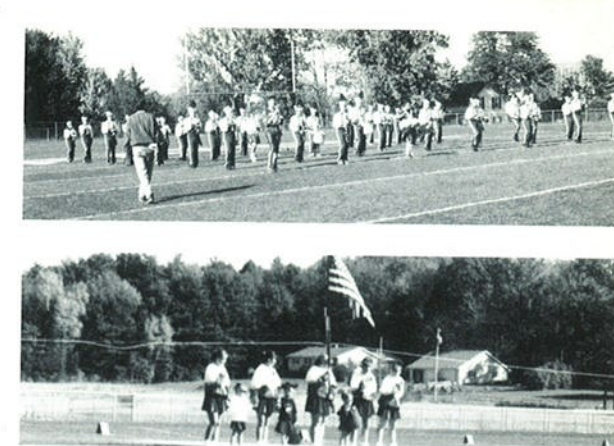
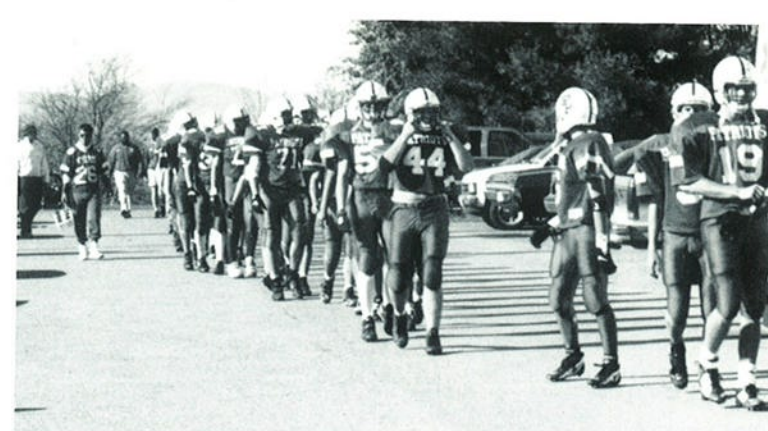
September 4, 1997

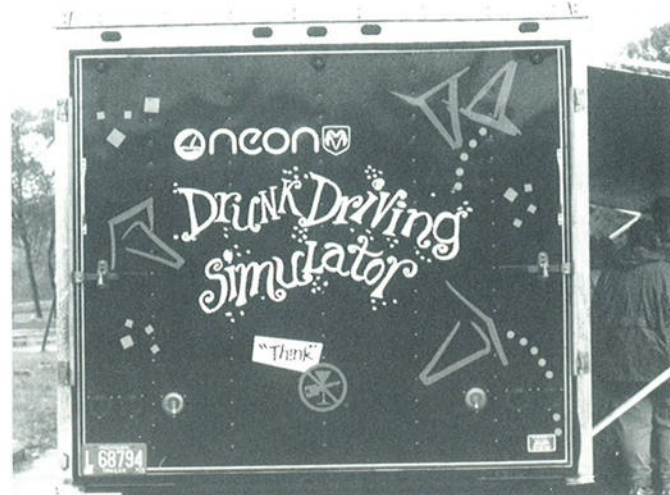

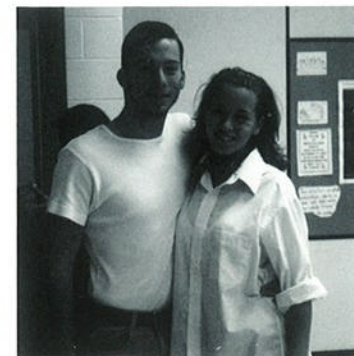
SADD DEAD DAY



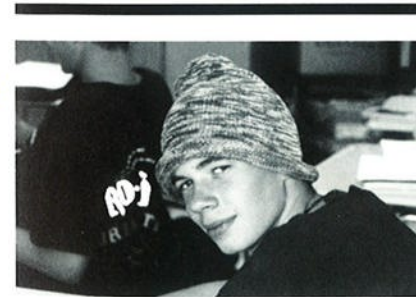
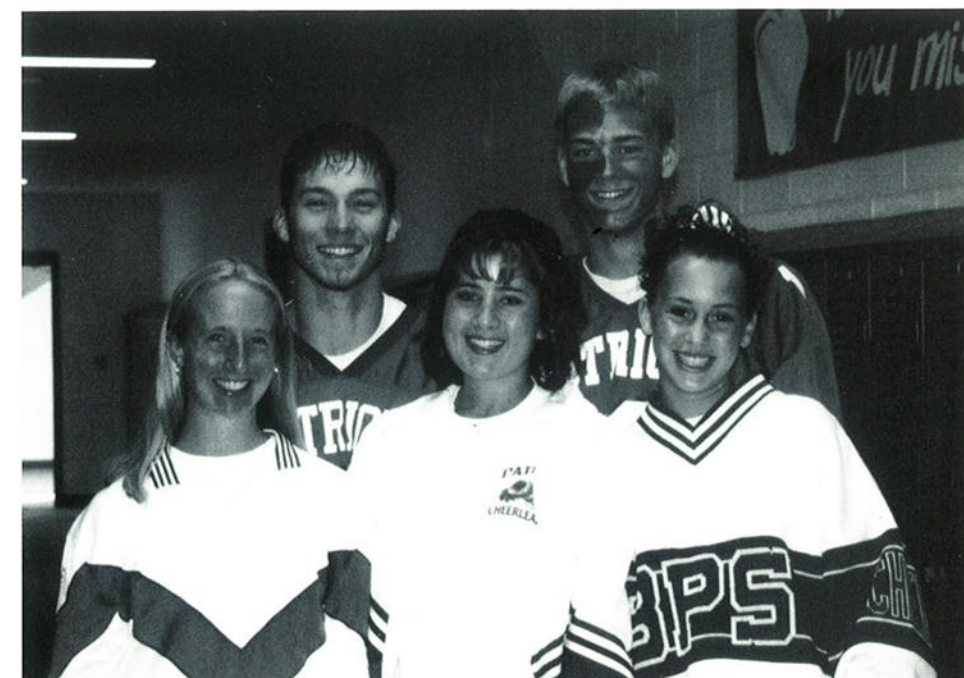
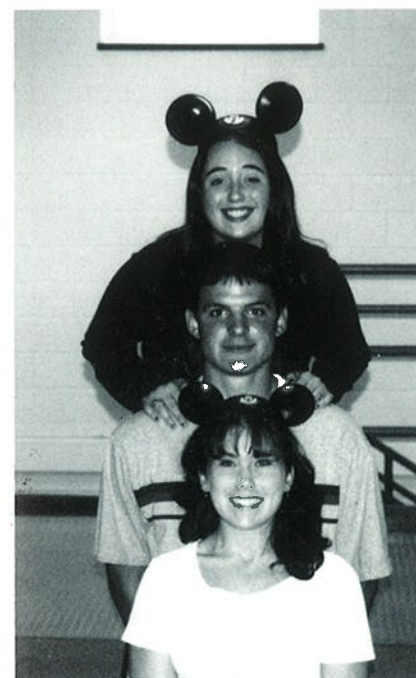

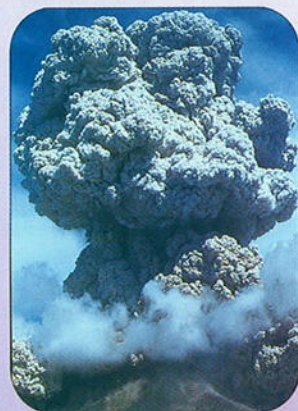

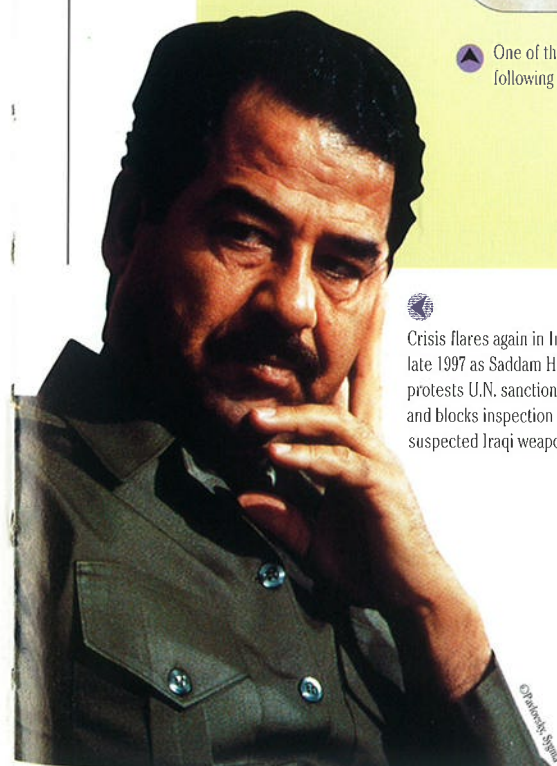

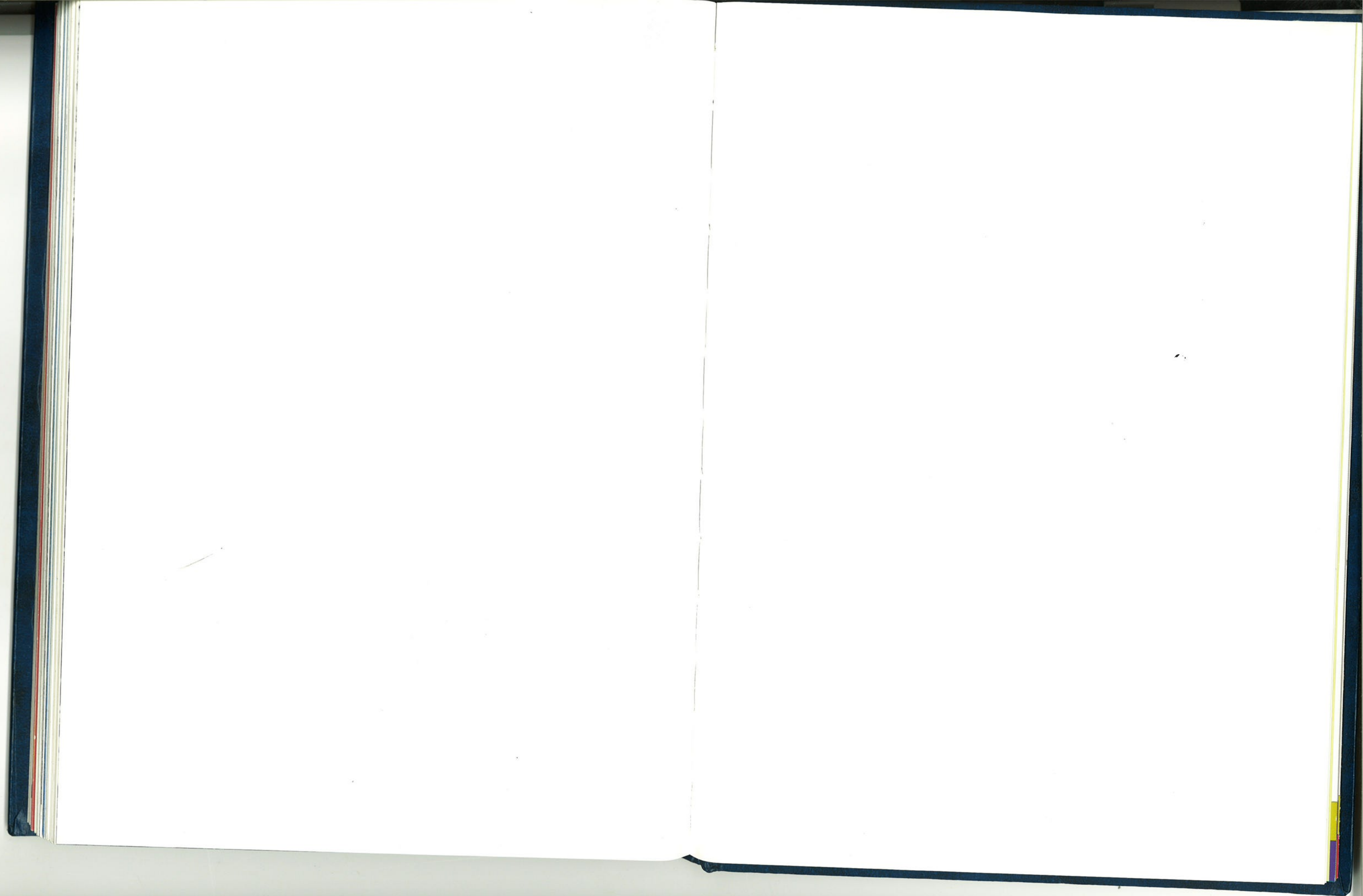

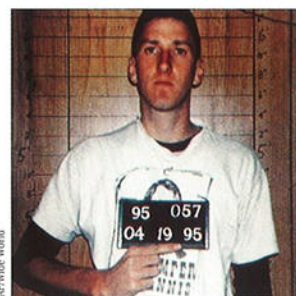

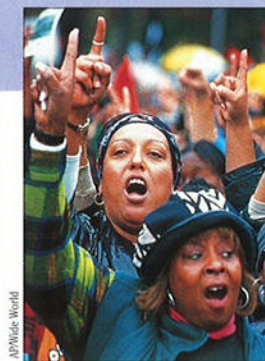

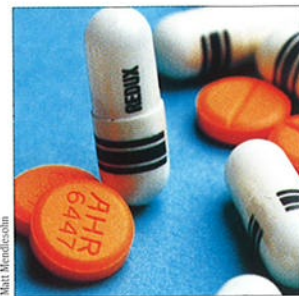

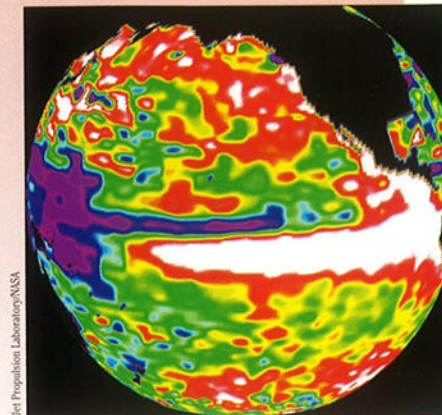

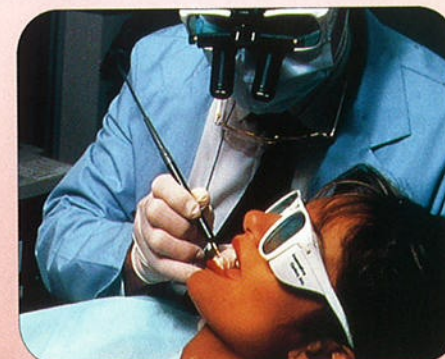

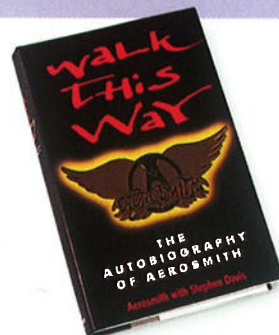

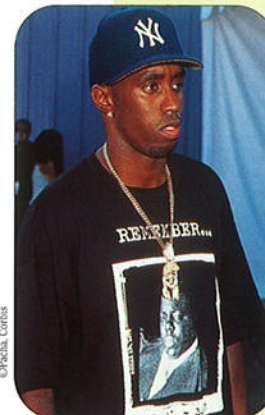

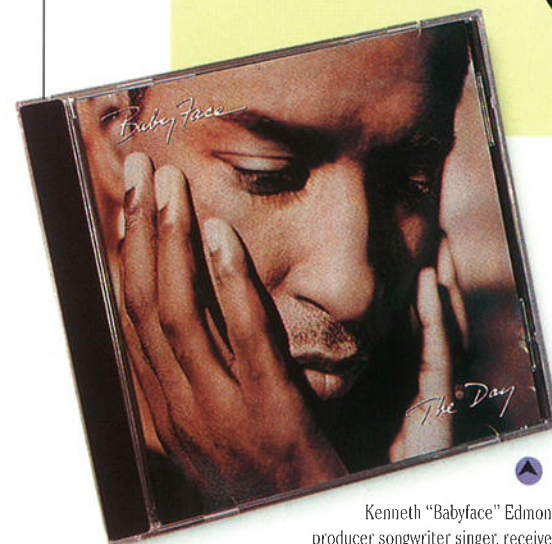

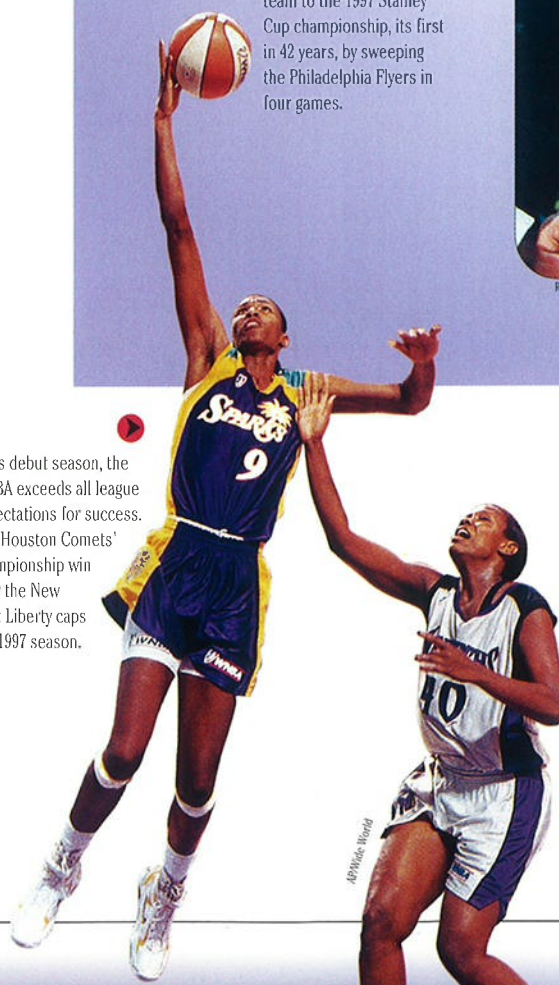
