Daniel Krawcjeski was much more than just Broadalbin-Perth's football coach. Some called him a teacher and some called him a friend.

This caring man proudly stood as an example of kindness. His shocking death, at the age of 47, saddened all those whose lives he had touched. Mr. Krawcjeski was a school teacher at Broadalbin-Perth. He had taught Social Studies and drivers' education for the past 25 years. He was head varsity football coach and earlier he had taught baseball and basketball at Broadalbin-Perth. He was also a coach for Gloversville Little League.

After the Perth football program ended, Mr. Krawcjeski came forward and started to rebuild the program in the early 1980's. Then, gradually the Patriots returned to their strong level of competitiveness.

The highlight of the program came in 1988, when Mr. K guided the Patriots to the Northern Adirondack League Small School Championship enroute to a 9-1 record. For his efforts, Mr. K was named coach of the year by the NAL. After that season, Broadalbin-Perth finished second in three of the next four years, competing in the NAL Large School division.

He was an example of understanding and fairness to all people, especially the students. Mr. Krawcjeski will be missed in the halls of the Broadalbin-Perth Middle School, and on the sidelines of the football field, where he was at home. But his memory and the lessons of life that he taught will not be forgotten.

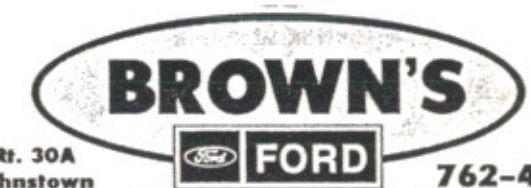

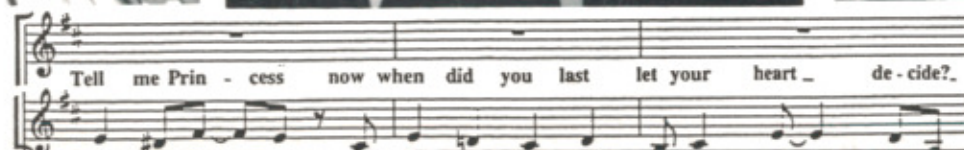

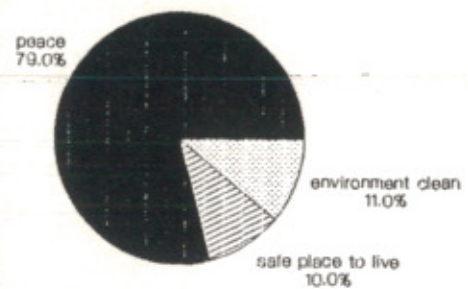
