B. H. S. VARSITY RECORD

The colorful Varsity, under the able direction of Coach William "Bill" Stillman, again triumphed in the Tri-County League. For the fifth consecutive year the team remained undefeated in the circuit to establish an all time high mark of fifty-one games without a setback. The Blue and White Varsity teams have now captured the title for seven straight years and have won 72 out of 75 games played.

The team spurred under the leadership of diminutive Captain "Chuck" Warren and hung up one of the best records in this part of the state by winning 17 out of 18 games. The one defeat being a heartbreaking overtime defeat to a powerful Johnstown five.

In the Tri-County League this year the team chalked up two more records, the best defensive play by holding Fonda to a low 9 points, and the best mark on offensive was created by rolling up 85

points against Fultonville.

Broadalbin accepted a bid to participate in the third class "A" Invitation Little Falls Tournament. The team made a good showing against Class "A" Schools. Johnson City scored a 50 to 42 victory and Syracuse Vocational (one of the strongest clubs in central New York) managed to eke out a 40 to 38 win in one of the best games played in the entire tournament. Capt. Warren was honored by a place on the All Tournament Team as a result of his sparkling performances.

The 1944-45 team will be minus John Swan, second high scorer and dependable pivot man, also George Farley, a capable back guard.

An unusual factor of this year's team is that it is made up principally of Juniors with a Sophomore on the first five. The team started with only one hold over from last year's team. The average height of the team is only 5 ft. 6 in.
