CLASS HISTORY

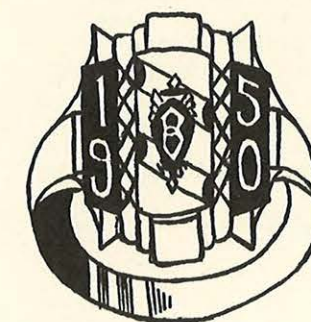

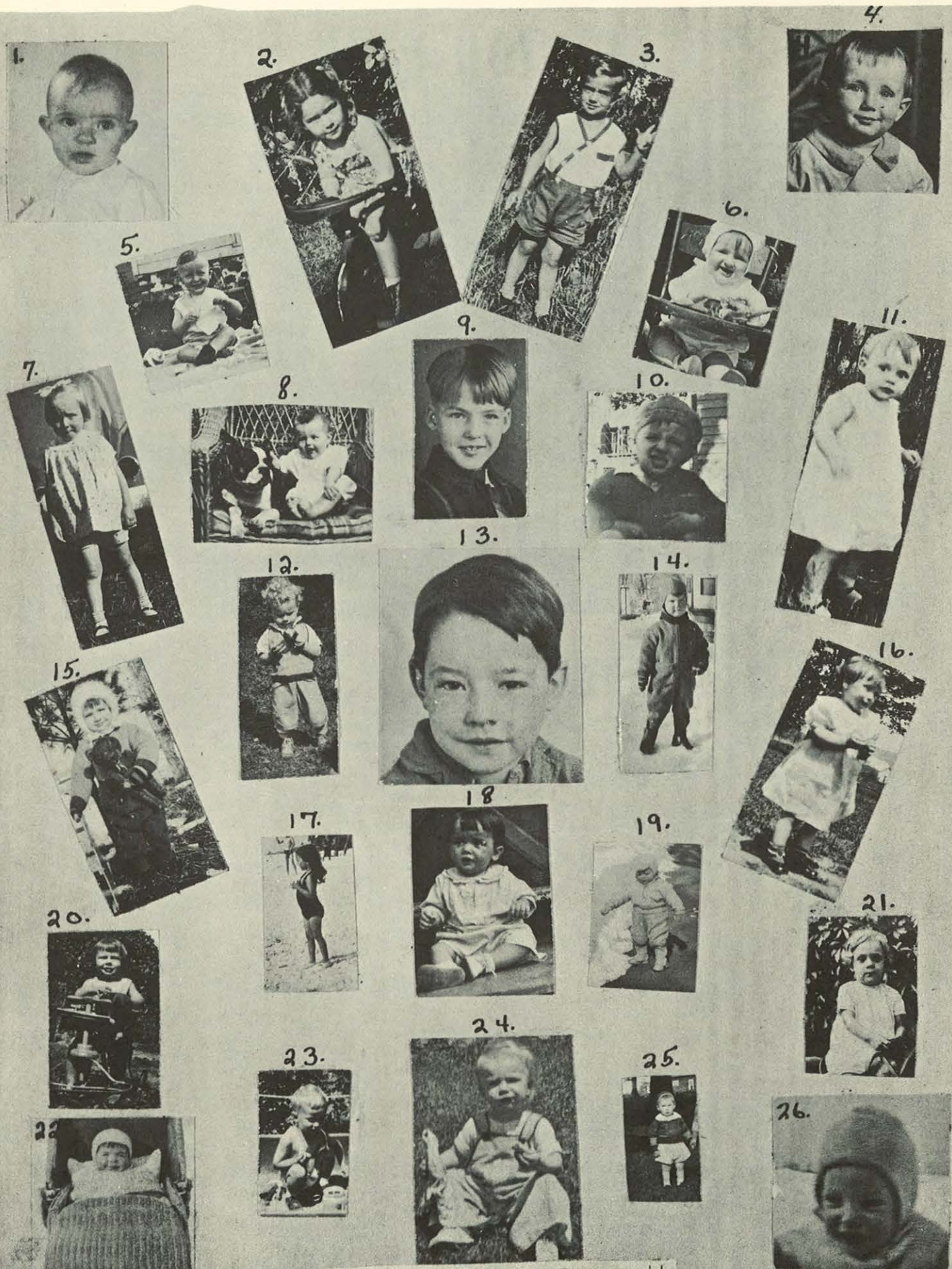
