

I want to begin by welcoming you to the new school year. It is great to be back with the students. Just to give you a little history about our school, I have been the principal of SY Jackson for 20 years. Both of my children went to school here, so I have been at the school as a parent or the principal for 25 years. The school opened in 1972 and this is the 50th anniversary of the school. We have close to 70 staff members and about 85% of the staff either had their children go to SY or they are currently enrolled here. There are 500 students. About 25% of our students are attending the school on a transfer. We currently have a waiting list of about 35 who we were not able to get in this year. There are 4 teachers at every grade level, which I feel is the ideal size. SY Jackson is named after Sherwin Young Jackson. He was on the APS school board for over 20 years, was on the Chamber of Commerce for many years, was a founder of the Lobo Club, and helped to create CNM. He owned a dry cleaners in Albuquerque for his business.

SY Jackson was recognized as a National Blue Ribbon School during the 2020 school year. This is based on 5 years worth of data and a school is nominated by the state's Public Education Department. There are specific criteria that have to be met and it is not easy to reach this designation. There are over 400,000 public, private, and charter schools in the United States. Only 467 of those schools were designated as a National Blue Ribbon School. You can be selected for closing the achievement gap or for Excellence in Education. We were designated for Excellence in Education. As a staff, we were really proud to be part of this distinguished group. We also know that this does not happen without a wonderful community. We are all part of the team working to educate the children and we could not do it without all you. Our school motto is "One Team, One Goal: Student Success". It really is a team effort and it takes the school and families to help the student be successful. Thank you for being part of our SY Family and our SY Team. It is a great place to be.

Greetings From The Health Office



The Health Office is receiving many questions from parents about whether they should send their students to school if they aren't feeling well. If your student has **any** of the following symptoms they should be kept home and tested for COVID-19 before returning to school **OR** if they develop any of the following symptoms while at school, they will be sent home from school:

- Temperature 100.4 degrees or higher, chills
- Sore throat, runny nose or congestion
- New frequent, dry cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Diarrhea, vomiting or nausea
- Loss of taste or smell
- Headache
- Fatigue or muscle or body aches

Testing for COVID-19 is highly recommended even if a person has only one symptom. For new onset symptoms, a negative PCR test (not rapid antigen test) is now required for return to school. PCR testing is done through Vault, Curative and the NMDOH.

If a student's PCR test result is <u>negative</u>, and they have <u>no known exposure to a positive case</u>, then they may return to school (with proof of negative test) when they have been fever-free for 24 hours and symptoms are improving.

If the student <u>doesn't test or tests positive</u> for COVID-19, the student can return to school after 10 days from initial symptoms (with improving symptoms and fever-free for 24 hours).

If a student is a <u>close contact of a confirmed positive case (including family members)</u>, their quarantine time is 10-20 days depending on the individual circumstances. Do not send your student to school if they are a close contact of a confirmed positive case regardless of the student's test results.

<u>If your student is sent home from school with any of the above symptoms</u>, the same criteria for COVID-19 testing apply.

The above guidelines are from the NMPED's "School Staff and Student Decision Tree" pictured below and provides a visual reference of the above information.

Guidelines are subject to change per direction of NMPED, NMDOH & APS.



COVID-19 RESPONSE TOOLKIT FOR NEW MEXICO'S PUBLIC SCHOOLS

School Staff and Student Decision Tree

The following decision tree was created for families, students, and staff to better understand the steps that should be taken if an individual develops symptoms. Testing of close contacts (strongly encouraged) should happen five days into quarantine, or at onset of symptoms. A negative test for an unvaccinated close contact of a COVID-19 positive individual does not end the quarantine period.



Symptoms in a Recovered Individual: If a person is positive for COVID-19, completes their self-isolation, recovers, and then develops new COVID-like symptoms within 90 days of their first infection, they should stay home until fever-free for at least 24 hours without fever-reducing medication and with improvement in symptoms. They may consider consulting their healthcare provider for additional guidance. If a person who was positive for COVID-19 more than 90 days ago develops new COVID-like symptoms, they should follow the same guidance as for someone who was never previously a case.
