MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD



Dear Parents, Grandparents and Guardians,

As is usual at MPS, we have had another action-packed week, with pupils participating in a wide variety of activities. At the start of the week over 150 pupils took their LAMDA (drama) exams, and some then demonstrated their impressive skills at the Tea, Dance and Drama event on Tuesday. Tea was also on the menu at the Year 6-8 Tea and Music concert on Thursday, and today we were treated to the creative accomplishments of Years 3-5 who displayed their amazing artwork in the Assembly Hall. Also today, Key Stage 1 took advantage of the lovely weather with a trip to Kilve beach (I was quite jealous I missed that!), while Years 3 and 4 headed to the University of Exeter's Northcott Theatre to watch Demon Dentist. A huge well done to all those involved in drama, music and sport this week.

As you may be aware, Millfield's Giving Day will be taking place on 24 May. This year it will centre on the topic of Philanthropy, and OM Galahad Clark came to talk to Year 7 and 8 pupils yesterday about the philanthropic heritage of Millfield and concepts such as social entrepreneurship, global citizenship and how business can be a force for good. He raised some interesting questions about sustainability and gave us some pretty terrifying facts, such as that 24 billion shoes are made each year, almost all of which end up in landfill at some point in the future. He also spoke about his passion for more natural shoes, and the irony that his ancestors were part of the 'problem' creating shoes that restrict our feet.

For me, I was most inspired when I spent time with Galahad after his talk and he mentioned that Millfield had sown the seed in him of being able to challenge the status quo. This is of course something we look to support all our pupils with as they grow up – being a challenger is one of our school values. I do hope that some others who heard him will be inspired to be a positive challenger when they see things they would like to change.

Millfield Prep will be celebrating Giving Day throughout next week, with Beat the Teacher activities taking place during lunch break on Monday and Tuesday. Please encourage your children to see if they can beat teachers at chess, a Latin challenge, football, netball, basketball, table tennis or a historical challenge. On Wednesday, there will also be an opportunity for the pupils to enjoy an inflatable obstacle course as part of the Millfield-wide whole school Giving Day.




INTER-HOUSE ATHLETICS




WESSEX WATER

On Thursday, Year 5 visited the Wessex Water Education Centre at Ashford Reservoir to start their topic on rivers and the water cycle. The children had a great day becoming scientists: measuring the pH, nitrate, oxygen and chlorine level in different water samples. They then had a tour of the treatment centre to learn about the process of cleaning water and finished off with a nature walk around the reseviour. The children loved exploring how water gets to our taps and the processes it goes through.















Year 7 geographers are learning about life in a low income country - Kenya. They have been comparing the climate in the United Kingdom with Kenya and discovering how to interpret climate graphs, a red line graph for temperature and a blue bar graph for rainfall. They have also developed an understanding about why many people in low income countries migrate from rural to urban areas and the push and pull factors linked to this. The pupils were given the challenge of identifying these factors and created a 'push' hand (things people want to get away from) and a 'pull' hand, (things pulling people towards city life).


