Course participants will explore the theories and research that serve as the basis for the Nevada English Language Development (ELD) Standards Framework and how to successfully implement evidence-based instructional practices that support steady progression toward English language proficiency and achievement in academic content areas. Participants will also deepen their understanding of how to prioritize culturally and linguistically responsive and sustaining instructional practices and be expected to demonstrate understanding of the key theories and research, evidence-based practices, and identify/enhance ELD practices that are aligned with the Nevada Educator Performance Framework (NEPF).
