Our current Board has a combined 43 years of dedicated service to making MISD the "best district in Texas."

Our Magnolia ISD Board has been fiscally responsible, with the lowest tax rate in over 20 years (\$1.1472). This is the second lowest tax rate in Montgomery County.

The Board has saved over \$56 million through our bond defeasance plan. This foresight has positioned our district for the growth happening in our area. The voters passed the November 2022 bond to address the growth that will bring three new schools, program enhancements, technology, and security upgrades.

The Board commits \$1.5 million of the budget to safety and security in our schools. This is done in partnership with Precinct 5 Constable Jones' Office. As MISD is committed to being the best district in Texas, this also means being a leader in the safety and security of our schools.


