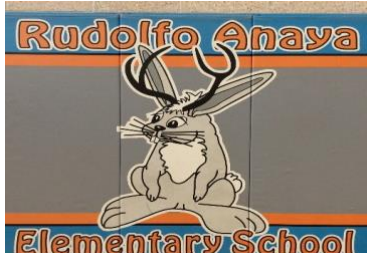




## MISSION STATEMENT

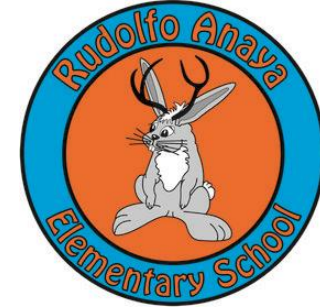

Family Engagement Policy 2020-2021



***The purpose of our Parent Engagement Policy is to ensure that we involve our parents in planning high quality, research-based, standards-aligned, data-driven instructional programs for students at Rudolfo Anaya Elementary School.***

***To that end we will:***

1. Administration will host monthly “coffee with the principal” meetings. This will provide a forum for community members to meet with the principal to get an update on school-wide news and share any concerns. These dates will be published on the website, school newsletters, school messenger and marquee to assure that everyone has the opportunity to be involved. Sign-in sheets will document parent participation.

2. Conference schedule and school-wide activities will be published on the website. Title 1 funds will be used to provide meals and child care for parent meetings scheduled for more than one hour.

3. Communication from the school will include monthly newsletters, website updates, school messenger, student agendas, face to face meetings and updated marquee.

•Individual student progress will be communicated consistently via student agendas, 6-week progress reports, standards-based report cards and parent teacher conferences each trimester.

4. The school will host two curriculum nights. Literacy night will take place in the fall with hands-on activities that students and families can complete at home to increase student performance. STEM night will be held in the spring. Families will have the opportunity to learn how they can support their child at home with science and math concepts through take-home activities.



5. Parents not satisfied with the Title 1 program plan may submit comments to the school. These comments and all correspondence from parents will be shared with the district and also placed in the site Title 1 notebook. Input will be used in the evolution of the program.

6. A compact has been developed which spells out the commitments of all stake holders involved with the Title 1 program with regards to achievement, communication, participation and safety.

7. Parent meeting will involve training and discussion focused on the needs and interests of the parent community. Invitations will be provided in the home language of the family and interpreters will be in attendance at all meetings.

8. Funds will be set aside in the Title 1 budget to the offset of the expense of Volunteer Background Checks so that both student safety and volunteer participation are addressed. Volunteer opportunities outside of the classroom will be offered to parents who may have difficulty obtaining a clear background check.
