



# iReady Diagnostic

## Testing from Home Instructions (Elementary)



### Before Testing:

1. Watch this [video](#) to familiarize yourself with the iReady Diagnostic assessment.
2. Find a quiet space for student to take the test.
3. Gather paper and pencil for student to utilize during the test (as needed).
4. Talk with your child about why they are taking the test (to show what they know), explain that families cannot help them answer any questions (it is okay to answer incorrectly or not know the answer- that's how the test works), and encourage them to do their best! This is not for a grade!
5. Teachers will help determine a time for students to take the test. The test is untimed and can be split into several short sessions. We recommend testing earlier in the day, if possible.
  - a. Grades K-2, 15-20 minute sessions
  - b. Grades 3-5, 30 minute sessions
6. Teacher will provide student login information.
7. Check with the teacher to confirm if student is taking the Math and/or Reading test.
8. Make sure the audio on the computer is working or use headphones.
9. No outside electronic devices permitted (calculators, cell phones, tablets, etc...).

### How to Login:

From a Desktop or Laptop Computer:

1. From Chrome, Firefox, Safari, or Edge, navigate to <https://login.i-ready.com/>
2. Enter username and password provided by teacher.
  - a. Username is usually Student Initials-APS ID# (Example: AB-900000000)
  - b. Password is the word "student".
  - c. Grades K-1 may have a K-1 Login card instead.  
Login card picture to enter information.
3. Students may also log in to iReady through [my.aps.edu](https://my.aps.edu) (Classlink).
4. Once student logs in, choose Math or Reading to begin the assessment.

From an iPad:

1. The free *iReady for students* application needs to be downloaded from the App store- Apple. APS devices should already have this downloaded.
2. Student will enter username and password provided by the teacher to begin.

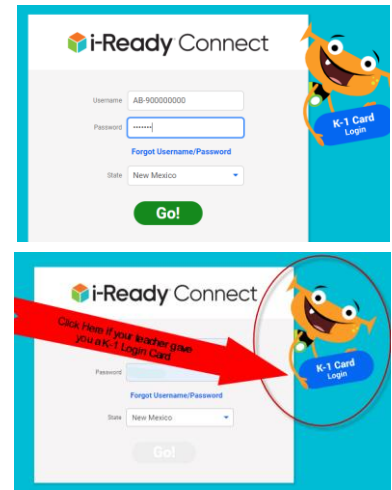

### During Testing:

1. Monitor and encourage student during the assessment (every 8-10 minutes).
2. Do not provide any hints or answers to student; this may lead the teacher to have inaccurate information about student's skills resulting in the wrong level of instructional support.
3. Grades K-1: It is okay to help student with using the mouse, if needed.
4. Ensure student is not just clicking through the test (rushing) or not spending too much time on one question, either. Remind them to try their best, but that it is okay to make a guess on some questions.

### Ensure Completion:

1. Student can log out and continue test at another time/day.
2. Student will receive a congratulatory message when finished and teacher will confirm completion.
