


The menu is now available on our website. Menu changes may occur.

Attendance Matters! All Day, Every Day!

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Petroglyph's Attendance Team is excited to welcome our students to a new school year filled with opportunities to learn and engage!

Given the ongoing pandemic, we want to assure you that we are taking every step possible to make our school environment is a place where everyone can be safe, healthy and learning. Know that while we cannot anticipate every situation that may arise this school year, we will do our best to listen and partner with you so that our students have a successful year.

This year we want to make sure every student misses no more than 9 days of school, or 1 day a month. We need your help.

We realize some absences are for health or other reasons. But, when students are absent 2 or more days a month (or 18 days over the school year), they can fall far behind in their learning. Excused and unexcused absences both mean missing classroom learning time. Absences can add up. *Attending school has a huge impact on student success*.

Some Attendance Tips:

- Make sure your students keep a regular bedtime and establish a morning routine.
- Turn off all electronics including TVs, phones and tablets at bedtime.
- Make sure clothes and pack backpacks are ready the night before.
- Check with our school nurse if you are not sure about when to keep your child at home due to illness.
- Avoid scheduling vacations or doctor's appointments when school is in session.

Please let us know how we can best support you and your student so that they can show up for school on time every day. We have a great attendance team here at Petroglyph Elementary. If your student or anyone in your family is experiencing a situation that is making it difficult for your student to come to school or be on time, please let us know.

Please make sure you call in to report an absence. It also important that we have your most recent email and phone number so we can reach you easily.

Quick Reminders:



Wednesday – Early Release 1:00pm

*Our school hours are Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from 8:50 am - 3:50 pm. Wednesday, we have the same arrival time, but dismissal at 1:00 pm. Students are not be left unattended at Petroglyph until staff is on duty until that time, so please do not leave your children unattended before 8:50 am.

*Just a reminder that parents/family members are not allowed in our school. We ask that if you are at Petroglyph to pick up your child at the end of the day, that you wait for them outside in the grassy area by our flag pole; or in your car while in the drop-off lane.

* STUDENT PICK-UP AREA / PICK-UP AND DROP-OFF PROCEDURES

 pulling up to the designated curb in front of the school, remaining in the car, and letting the child in on the curbside door

Because of the size of our school and the high volume of cars, it may take some time for cars to make the entire circuit of the parking lot. Please be patient and wait your turn to pick up your child. Cars may not park or pick up students in the fire lanes. Children will not walk between cars to get to their ride, whether or not an adult accompanies them. Parents who refuse to follow our safety standards may lose access to our campus.

Because of safety considerations, it is essential that parents observe the painted crosswalks and duty teachers' instructions when walking to parked cars. It is equally important to use only the west parking lot area (front of school) for vehicle pick-ups. There is no supervision at the base of the hill on Richmond Hills, and it is not a safe area for children.
