Mt. Diablo Unified School District Chart of Accounts

This is the Mt. Diablo Unified School District (MDUSD) Chart of Accounts. This Chart of Accounts represents the parts of the District account (budget) codes. Updates will be made as needed. The version date on the cover indicates the most current version. As updates are made from the previous version, they will be highlighted in color.

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SACS Budget Code -- 32 Digit Structure

AA - BBBB - CCCC - DDDD - EEEEE - FFF - GGG - HHH - IIII

- A. Fund* This two-digit code establishes a fiscal and accounting entity. Certain funds are required when designated activities are conducted. Examples -- Adult Education Fund and Child Development Fund.
- B. Resource* This four-digit code is used to classify revenues and resulting expenditures in accordance with restrictions or special reporting requirements. This field will tell you if it is Title I, LCFF, etc. dollars.
- C. Goal* This four-digit code identifies which student population receives this service -- regular classes, special education classes, vocational education, adult education, etc. Goals are usually instructional, community services and/or child care services. The code "0000" is used for undistributed services. "Whom are you serving?"
- D. Function* This four-digit code describes activities or services performed in order to accomplish the goal. Function will break out instruction, instruction related services, pupil services, community services, general administration, and facilities services, etc. "What are you doing?"
- E. Program This five-digit code indicates district assigned numbers identifying departments and budget authority, district sub-divisions. Administrators/Managers can view multiple programs together under their budget oversight.
- F. Project This three-digit code indicates district assigned numbers identifying capital construction projects, Bond funded projects and state funded (modernization) projects.
- G. Location This three-digit code indicates the actual (assigned) location of an activity. Both school sites and central offices/departments use this code to identify local budget control. "Where is it happening?"
- H. Manager This three-digit code indicates the budget manager.
- I. Object* This four-digit code indicates the type of purchase or service.

- 1110-1000 (used to be 10) Instruction. Includes activities dealing directly with the interaction between teachers and students. Teaching may be provided for students in a school classroom or in another location, such as a home or hospital. It may also be provided through some other approved medium, such as computers, television, radio, telephone, and correspondence. Included here are the activities of aides or classroom assistants or any type (readers, teaching machines, etc.) who assist in the instructional process. If a stipend is paid to a teacher for any non-instructional function, the stipend should be coded to the appropriate function. Expenditures for departments' chairpersons who teach part-time should be prorated using the full-time equivalent (FTE) ratio. Full-time department chairpersons' expenditures should be included in Function 39, School Administration. Expenditures for instructional technology, which include computers, routers and servers, software licenses, communication lines, and computer maintenance costs, may be coded to Function 10, Instruction, where they can be identified directly with the classroom. Instructional functions may not be used in capital project funds.
- **57xx-1110 (used to be 11) Special Education Instruction.** Specialized instruction provided to special education students with individualized education programs (IEPs). This function measures the cost of those personnel who work directly with the students to teach them.
- 57xx-1120 (used to be 16) Special Education, Resource Specialist Instruction.

 Salaries, supplies, and other costs to provide instruction and services for those students whose needs have been identified in an IEP, who receive services under the direction of a resource specialist, and who are assigned to another classroom or a special education separate class for a majority of a school day.
- **0000-2100 (used to be 36) Supervision of Instruction.** Activities primarily for assisting instructional staff in planning, developing, and evaluating the process of providing learning experiences for students use this function. These activities include curriculum development, techniques of instruction, understanding of child development, staff training, and so forth. This function includes both staff members with supervisory duties as well as staff members who are singularly involved with projects to improve curriculum and guidance of teachers in the use of instructional materials. This function also includes special project administration.
- **0000-2420** (used to be 37) Instructional Library, Media, and Technology. Activities concerned with the use of all teaching and learning resources, including hardware and content materials, methods, or experiences used for teaching and learning purposes. These activities consist of selecting, preparing, caring for, and making available to members of the instructional staff audiovisual equipment and material, education programs presented through television services, and computer-assisted instruction services. This category also includes guiding individuals in the use of library books and materials. All educational media include printed and nonprinted sensory materials. Instructional technology costs

identified with computer labs and other instructional support centers may be charged to Instructional Library, Media, and Technology where they can be directly identified to it.

- **0000-2490 (used be 38) Other Instructional Resources.** Other activities that provide students the resources to achieve the appropriate student learning outcomes. Parent participation and involvement activities are charged to this function.
- **0000-2700 (used to be 39) School Administration.** Activities concerned with directing and managing the operation of a particular school. The activities include those performed by the principal, assistant principals, and other assistants while they supervise all operation of the school, evaluate the staff members of the school, assign duties to staff members, supervise and maintain the records of the school, and coordinate school instructional activities with those of the LEA. These activities also include the work of clerical staff in support of the teaching and administrative duties. Other school administration services include graduation expenses and department chairpersons.
- **0000-3110 (used to be 40) Guidance and Counseling Services.** Activities involving counseling with students and parents; consulting with other staff members on learning problems; evaluating the abilities of students; assisting students as they make their own educational and career plans and choices; assisting students in personal and social development; providing referral assistance; and working with other staff members in planning and conducting guidance programs for students. This function includes information services, appraisal services, placement services, counseling services, and record maintenance services.
- **0000-3120 (used to be 41) Psychological Services.** Activities concerned with administering psychological tests and interpreting the results; gathering and interpreting information about student behavior; working with other staff members in planning school programs to meet the special needs of students as indicated by psychological tests and behavioral evaluation; and planning and managing a program of psychological services, including psychological counseling for students, staff, and parents.
- **0000-3130 (used to be 42)** Attendance and Social Work Services. Activities designed to improve student attendance at school and that attempt to prevent or solve student problems involving the home, the school, and the community.
- **0000-3140 (used to be 43) Health Services.** Physical and mental health services that are not direct instruction. Included are activities that provide students with appropriate medical, dental, and nursing services.
- **0000-3150 (used to be 44)** Speech Pathology and Audiology Services. Activities that identify, asses, and treat children with speech, hearing, and language impairments.

- **0000-3160 (used to be 45)** Pupil Testing Services. Cost of staff or consultants assigned to coordinate the standardized testing of students in academic contents. The cost of classroom teachers administering tests to their students during the instructional day remains a part of the instructional function.
- **0000-3600 (used to be 46) Pupil Transportation.** Activities concerned with conveying students to and from school. Costs in this function include: Transportation supervisors, directors, bus drivers, clerks, and bus maintenance personnel; fuel, oil, tires, and parts for buses; contracted repair of buses; bus driver training and certification; contracts with individuals, other districts, and firms for transporting pupils; rental of buses; acquisition and replacement of equipment used for transporting pupils, including buses. Costs in this function **exclude**: field trips, student organization trips, financing costs (e.g., principal and interest for acquisition of buses), principal and interest on school bus loans/capital leases, vehicles other than those used for student transportation.
- **0000-3700 (used to be 47) Food Services.** Activities concerned with providing food to students and staff in a school. This service area includes preparing and serving regular and incidental meals, lunches or snacks in connection with school activities and food delivery. Costs in this function **exclude** food purchases for meetings or workshops or to instruct students on food preparation.
- **0000-3900 (used to be 48)** Other Pupil Services. Other support services to students not classified elsewhere in the Function 40's.
- 1110-4000 (used to be 49) Ancillary Services. School-sponsored activities during or after the school day that are not essential to the delivery of services in Function 10's, 30's, or 40's. These activities are generally designed to provide students with experiences such as motivation and enjoyment and improvement of skills in either a competitive or noncompetitive setting. This includes school-sponsored co-curricular activities and school-sponsored athletics.
- **8100-5000 (used to be 50) Community Services.** Activities concerned with providing community services to community participants other than students. Examples of this function would be the operation of a community swimming pool, a recreation program for the elderly, a child care center for working mothers, and so on. This function is also used for scholarship payments.
- **0000-6000 (used to be 51) Enterprise.** Activities that are financed and operated in a manner similar to private business enterprises, where the stated intent is that the costs are financed or recovered primarily through user charges. Food services should not be charged here, but rather to Function 47 because costs are financed in large part through federal and state revenues. This function is used when a school or district is selling goods or services to outside organizations. For example, the district provides computer services to other districts on a fee basis.

- **0000-7100 (used to be 52)** Board and Superintendent. Activities concerned with establishing and administering a policy for operating the district.
- **0000-7200 (used to be 53) Other General Administration.** Activities other than Function 52, Board and Superintendent, which manage the district as an overall entity. Other General Administration activities include fiscal services, personnel services, and central support services. Certain insurance should be charged to the appropriate function, such as Function 10, Instruction, for pupil insurance; Function 46, Transportation, for insurance on buses.
- 0000-7700 (used to be 54) Data Processing Services. This function is for expenditures/expenses for data processing services, whether in-house or contracted. Examples of this function are costs for computer facility management, computer processing, systems development, analysis and design, and those interfacing costs associated with general types of technical assistance to data users. Specific types of applications include attendance accounting, grade reporting, financial accounting, and human resources/personnel. Personal computers (PCs) that are stand-alone are to be charged to the appropriate function. Peripherals, including terminals and printers are to be charged to the appropriate function. Costs associated with mainframe, minicomputers, and networked or stand-alone microcomputers that provide services to multiple functions are to be recorded here. Costs in this function exclude stand-alone or networked computers used by a specific functional area, instructional computer networks and instructional technology coordinator.
- **0000-8110** (used to be 55) Goal should be 8100 for SACS Fund 21, 25, 35, 49, and 51) **Maintenance.** Activities involved with repairing, restoring, or renovating school property, including grounds, buildings, site improvements, building fixtures, and service systems.
- **0000-8200 (used to be 56) Operations.** Activities concerned with keeping the physical plant clean and ready for daily use. They include operating the heating, lighting, and ventilation systems, trash collection, caring for grounds, and other housekeeping activities that are repeated on a daily, weekly, monthly, or seasonal basis.
- **0000-8300 (used to be 57) Security.** Activities concerned with maintaining order and safety in school buildings, on the grounds, and in the vicinity of schools at all times. Included are police activities for school functions, traffic control on grounds and in the vicinity of schools, building alarm systems, and hall monitoring services.
- **0000-8500 (used to be 58) Facilities Acquisition and Construction.** Activities concerned with acquiring land and buildings, remodeling buildings, constructing buildings, and additions to buildings, initially installing or extending service systems and other building equipment, and improving sites.

- **0000-8700 (used to be 59)** Facilities Rents and Leases. This function is for costs of facility operating leases or rented facilities. This does not include capital lease payments.
- **0000-7210 (used to be 64) Indirect Costs.** Indirect costs are district-wide expenditures for general management activities that are not readily identifiable with a particular program but necessary for the overall operation of the district (e.g., accounting, payroll, personnel management, purchasing, centralized data processing). Indirect costs represent an allocation of these district administrative costs to educational programs on a percentage basis. The actual indirect cost rate for each year is computed according to a formula provided by the State. Indirect costs will be charged on your *actual* non-5100 and non-6000 object expenditures.
- **0000-7120 (used to be 66) Negotiations.** This function is for costs of activities concerned with staff relations system-wide and the responsibilities for contractual negotiations with both instructional and non-instructional personnel.

Commonly Used Object Code Descriptions

- 4110 **Approved Textbooks and Core Curricula Materials.** Record expenditures for classroom instructional materials designed for use by pupils and their teachers as the basic curriculum adopted by the State Board of Education or the district board for required subject matter. Instructional materials may be printed or appear in some other form (for instance, Internet-based) and may consist of textbooks, technology-based materials, and other educational materials, such as manipulatives (*Education Code* Section 60010[h]).
- 4210 **Books and Other Reference Materials**. Record expenditures for books and other reference materials used by district personnel. Books used for reference are further identified by the appropriate function. For example, reference books for use in the nurse's office, in the district business office, or in the cafeteria would be coded to Function 43, Health Services; Function 53, Other General Administration; or Function 47, Food Services, respectively. Function 10, Instruction, would include (1) books that have not been adopted by the proper authority for use as basic curricula; (2) books, such as reference books, that are available for general use by students even though such books may be used solely in the classroom; and (3) all other materials used for reference purposes.

Generally, the purchase of library books or other reference materials is coded to Object 4210. However, expenditures for library books to stock a new school library or for material expansion are recorded in Object 6310, Books and Media for New School Libraries or Major Expansion of School Libraries.

Consumable materials other than those directly related to adopted curricula (Object 4110) have a limited shelf life of less than one year. Materials such as periodicals, magazines, workbooks, drill books, exercise pads, and the like are recorded in Object 4300, Materials and Supplies.

4300 **Materials and Supplies.** Record expenditures for consumable materials and supplies and non-consumable items that do not meet the District's inventory threshold to be used by students, teachers, and other District personnel. Instructional materials and supplies are those used in the classroom by students and teachers. Other materials and supplies included in Object 4300 are those used in services and auxiliary programs, such as food service supplies; custodial supplies; gardening and maintenance supplies; supplies for operations; transportation supplies, including gasoline; supplies for repair and upkeep of equipment or buildings and grounds; and medical and office supplies.

Expenditures for rentals of materials are coded to Object 5600's, Rentals, Leases, Repairs, and Noncapitalized Improvements.

Incidental materials and supplies included in payments to outside vendors for repair and maintenance services are coded to Object 5600's, Rentals, Leases, Repairs, and Noncapitalized Improvements.

- 4400 **Noncapitalized Equipment.** Record expenditures for movable personal property of a relatively permanent nature that has an estimated useful life greater than one year and an acquisition cost less than the District's capitalization threshold (\$10,000, (\$5,000 for Federal funds)) but greater than the District's inventory threshold (\$500).
- 5100 **Subagreements for Services.** Record expenditures for subagreements and subawards pursuant to certain contracts, subcontracts, and subgrants. Subagreements for Services are indicated when a part or all of an instructional or support activity <u>for which the District is responsible</u>

is conducted by a third party rather than by the District. The District's responsibility for the activity may originate from any grant, award, or entitlement, including general purpose entitlements.

5210 **Travel and Conferences.** Record actual and necessary expenditures incurred by and/or for employees and other representatives of the District for travel and conferences (*Education Code* sections 35044 and 44032). Included in this object are fees paid for those individuals to attend conferences or training classes. Expenditures for employee conferences charged to this object should follow the goal and function of the employee.

Expenditures for conferences sponsored by the District are not coded to this object but are coded to the appropriate object for specific services purchased, such as Object 4391 for food, Object 5891 for caterers, Object 5612 for room rentals, and Object 2400's for staff time to prepare for the conference, in combination with Function 36, In-house Instructional Staff Development, or Function 53, Staff Development.

- 5300 **Dues and Memberships.** Record the fee for District membership in any society, association, or organization as authorized by *Education Code* Section 35172. Object 5300 may be used for the dues of an employee, such as a chief business official or a superintendent, if it is deemed that the District is represented and benefits from the membership.
- 56xx **Rentals, Leases, Repairs, and Non-capitalized Improvements.** Record expenditures for rentals, leases without option to purchase, and repairs or maintenance (including maintenance agreements) of sites, buildings, and equipment by outside vendors. Include incidental materials and supplies included in the cost of repairs.

Rental of facilities is normally charged to Function 59, Facilities Rents and Leases. The temporary rental of facilities incidental to a particular activity, such as the hourly or daily rental of a hall for a staff development workshop or the rental of an auditorium for a school graduation, is charged to the function of the benefiting activity.

5800 **Professional/Consulting Services.** Record expenditures for personal services rendered by personnel who are not on the payroll of the District. Professional/consulting services are delivered by an independent contractor (individual, entity, or firm) that offers its services to the public. Such services are paid on a fee basis for specialized services that are usually considered to be temporary or short term in nature, normally in areas that supplement the expertise of the District. This includes all related expenditures covered by the personal services contract.

Record expenditures for services such as printing, engraving, and so forth performed by an outside agency. This includes but is not limited to copies made from masters provided by the District.

May record up to \$25,000 for each individual subagreement as defined in Object 5100, Subagreements for Services. This is optional. The \$25,000 limit applies each year throughout the duration of the subagreement. The remainder of the subagreement must be recorded in Object 5100. *Note*: Expenditures to nonpublic, nonsectarian schools for the education of children with exceptional needs should be charged to Object 5100, Subagreements for Services. Expenditures for excess costs and/or deficits in special education programs paid to provider school districts or county offices should be charged to objects 7141–7143, Other Tuition.

xx85 **Technology Related Purchases.** Record expenditures that are commonly considered "technologies". The examples are: software applications, computer, laptop, docking station, Chromebook, Smartboard, monitor, webcam, mouse, keyboard, TV monitors, 3-D printer, and etc. When you purchase an entire set of desktop computer, a monitor, Microsoft office applications, and etc., the entire purchase should be coded to the same one code such as 4485, including the ewaste fees.

Please note the following items should not be coded to xx85: printers, facsimiles, scanners, a sound system, PA systems, ELMO projectors, charging carts, power strips, and etc.
