Gifted students and the Internet are naturals, but there are important factors to consider when using the Internet. Listed below are some tips to teach students before they go online:

Tips for students "surfing the 'Net"*

- Never give out your full name, address, or phone number to anyone online.
- Don't give out your parents' names either.
- Never agree to meet online friends face-to-face without first getting permission from your parents.
- Be aware that people might not be who they claim to be—someone who claims to be a 12-year-old girl could actually be a 40-year-old man.
- Never send photos of yourself to people you meet online without first getting permission from your parents.
- If someone sends you email or chat requests that make you uncomfortable, immediately show the message to your parents or a teacher.
- Treat strangers on the Internet the same way you treat strangers on the street.
- Do not give your password to anyone online.
