



#### 1. Aims

This policy aims to ensure that:

- Suitable education is arranged for pupils on roll who cannot attend school due to health needs
- · Pupils, staff and parents understand the school's responsibilities



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# 2. Legislation and guidance

This policy reflects the requirements of the Education Act 1996.

## 3. Responsibilities of the school

#### 3.1 If the school makes arrangements

Initially, the school will attempt to make arrangements to deliver suitable education for children with health needs who cannot attend school.

You may want to add more details on areas such as:

- Heads of Year will work with families to support in such cases. Heads of Year will report to the Senior Middle Leader in school for Pastoral care to ensure provision is appropriate to the students needs.
- School will seek to provide work where reasonable. This will primarily be done through the use of Google classroom where students can access learning material. Where subjects use other sources e.g. GCSEPod students will also be directed to use this as a resource.
- Parents will be involved in the outset of planning and will be asked to attend meetings to review the provision put in place.
- Heads of Year will coordinate reintegrating a student back into school after a period of absence. This
  would be done through any reasonable means which support the student e.g. modified timetable,
  reduced timetable, consideration of mobility support.

When reintegration is anticipated, school will work with families to:

- Plan for consistent provision during and after the period of education outside the school, allowing the pupil to access the same curriculum and materials that they would have used in school as far as possible
- Enable the pupil to stay in touch with school life (e.g. through newsletters, emails, invitations to school events or internet links to lessons from their school)
- Create individually tailored reintegration plans for each child returning to school
- Consider whether any reasonable adjustments need to be made
