

Supply List
For Incoming Eighth Graders 2023-24

General for all classes:

- Loose leaf paper
- 2-3 packs of Post-it notes
- Graph paper- (4 squares to an inch)
- Zipper pencil case with the following:
 - Pencils
 - Blue, black, red, and green pens
 - Colored pencils
 - Several highlighters

Technology:

- 1 pair of wired earbuds or headphones

English:

- Separate one-and-a-half-inch three-ring binder exclusively for English *or* an English section in a larger three-ring binder; binder must have inside sleeves, folders, dividers

Science:

- Lined paper notebook, preferably spiral with holes.
- Sturdy plastic folder for storing worksheets, handouts, packets, etc. OR a dedicated section in a larger folder case.
- Index Cards for flashcard use (1-2 packs of 200)

History:

- College ruled notebook
- Two pocket folders for storing worksheets, handouts, packets, etc. OR a dedicated section in a larger folder case.
- Index Cards for flashcard use (recommended but not required)

World Language:

- 3 Expo markers
- Small 3-ring binder / notebook *or* a folder that can hold worksheets *or* a section in a larger 3-ring binder
- Earbuds to keep in World Language classroom

Algebra 1, 1B, and Geometry

- Small 3-ring binder exclusively for math OR a math section in a larger 3-ring binder
* pocket folder for the binder
- Graph paper, 3-hole punched OR 3 graph paper spiral notebooks with folders included
- TI - 30X - IIS scientific calculator
- Dry erase markers
- Pencils with erasers
- 12” plastic ruler (for use at home)

The new math teacher may have additional supplies that students are required to purchase in the fall

Advisor

- A notebook- any style or design- OR an advisor section in a larger 3-ring binder.

As you think ahead to eighth grade, consider what system you are going to use to organize your materials. We suggest using one of the following:

- a Case It or Trapper-Keeper style case with an individual folder for each class and rings for workbooks, notebooks, and a planner
- individual, color-coded binders for each class

*A single folder is not appropriate to hold all of your handouts and notes in the eighth grade. You may try out different systems, but you must have some sort of plan!

All items brought to school, including clothing, should be clearly marked with student’s name. Name tags on clothing are **Highly Recommended**, similar to those on <http://www.namebubbles.com>, or written with a laundry marker, similar to Sharpie’s Rub-A-Dub Laundry Marker.
