

**Supply List
For Incoming Seventh Graders 2023-24**

As you think ahead to seventh grade, consider what system you are going to use to organize your materials. We suggest using one of the following:

- 10-13 section accordion expanding file folder
- Case It or Trapper-Keeper style case with an individual folder for each class and 3-ring capabilities for workbooks, notebooks, and planner
- Individual, color-coded binders for each class

A single folder is not sufficient to hold all of your handouts and notes in the seventh grade. You may try out different systems, but you must have some sort of plan!

General classroom supplies:

- Loose leaf paper
- 2-3 packs of Post-it notes
- Graph paper (4 squares to an inch)
- Zipper pencil case
- Pencils
- Blue, black, red, and green pens
- Colored pencils
- Several highlighters
- **1 pair of wired earbuds or headphones**

English:

- A separate 1.5" 3-ring binder exclusively for English *or* an English section in a larger 3-ring binder; binder must have inside sleeves, folders, and dividers.
- Marbled composition notebook

Social Studies:

- 1" binder with pockets *or* a sturdy folder that can hold worksheets

Science:

- A sturdy (plastic) folder that can hold worksheets
- Graph paper composition notebook
- 30 cm Metric Ruler (for use in school)
- Index Cards for flashcard use (1-2 packs of 200)

Pre-Algebra:

- 4 spiral graph paper notebooks
- TI-30X-IIS Scientific calculator
- 1 pocket folder
- 12" plastic ruler (for use at home)
- Dry erase markers

Algebra I or Algebra IA:

- 4 spiral graph paper notebooks (Algebra I)
- 3-ring binder *or* 2 folders with pockets (Algebra 1A)
- TI-30X-IIS Scientific calculator (both courses)
- Composition journal (both courses)
- Dry-erase markers (both courses)
- pencils with erasers
- 12” plastic ruler (for use at home)

World Language:

- 1” binder with loose leaf paper *or* section in a larger 3-ring binder
- Dry erase markers
- **Additional** earbuds to keep in World Language classroom (no need for French class)

All items brought to school, including clothing, should be clearly marked with student’s name. Name tags on clothing are highly recommended, similar to those on <https://www.namebubbles.com/>, or written with a laundry marker, similar to Sharpie’s Rub-A-Dub Laundry Marker.
