 - \$1.5 billion bond measure approved by voters in 2016



PROJECT OVERVIEW

- Campuswide transformation begins fall 2024 with anticipated completion summer 2027
- \$175 million investment funded by Measure Q
- Students and teachers relocated to Butler Middle School during construction
- School start time moved to 9 a.m.



NEW ADMINISTRATION/CLASSROOM BUILDING

- Two- to three-story modern learning facility
 - ✓ 102,000-square-foot building located along Cedar Avenue
 - \checkmark Science and general education classrooms
 - ✓ Air conditioning, AV systems, etc.
 - ✓ All-new classroom furniture
- New design will nod to existing building character



NEW AUDITORIUM BUILDING

- 14,000-square-foot building located along Pacific Avenue
 - \checkmark Increases gathering areas for meetings and events
 - ✓ Air conditioning, AV system, etc.
 - \checkmark Music room with practice rooms








NEW CAFETERIA & GYMNASIUM

- New cafeteria and dining area with ample seating
 - ✓ New kitchen with all-electric equipment in alignment with LBUSD Green Energy policy
- New gymnasium featuring:
 - ✓ Locker room
 - ✓ Fitness area
 - ✓ Indoor basketball court



NEW MEDIA CENTER

- Reimagined for 21st century learning
 - ✓ Laptop charging stations and distinct spaces for individual and collaborative learning
 - ✓ New parent center/community room







NEW WELLNESS CENTER

- Dedicated space for free, confidential services and connecting students, families and staff to vital community resources
 - ✓ Counseling
 - ✓ Empowerment/educational workshops
 - ✓ Other services



NEW COURTYARD

- Green, central space for outdoor learning and events
 - ✓ Trees and grassy areas
 - ✓ Shaded seating
 - ✓ Outdoor learning classrooms/reading garden



NEW ALL-WEATHER FIELD

- Synthetic turf field for increased playability and safety
 - \checkmark Located on rooftop of parking structure








NEW DROP-OFF/PICK-UP ZONE

- Designated location for student drop-off and pick-up located off Cedar Avenue
 - Alleviates traffic congestion during morning and afternoon drop-off and pick-up
 Eliminates double parking and helps ensure student safety





INTERIM HOUSING

- All students, teachers, and staff will be relocated during construction to interim housing at the Butler campus, 1400 E. 20th Street
 - o Interim housing: 2024-25 through 2026-27 school years
 - o Washington reopens: 2027-28 school year
- All Washington school activities will occur on the Butler campus, unless other arrangements are made



INTERIM HOUSING

- Transportation will be provided to the interim campus using multiple routes from and to Washington's attendance area
 - Riding the school bus is not mandatory
 - Parents may transport their student(s) directly to the interim campus or students may use other forms of transportation
