Directions: Write a well-organized essay that includes an introduction, several paragraphs addressing the task below, and a conclusion.

Theme: Government Role in the Economy

Throughout history, the United States government has taken various actions to address problems with the nation's economy.

- Discuss the historical circumstance that led to the action
- Discuss the impact of this action on the economy of the United States

You may use any example from your study of United States history. Some suggestions you might wish to consider include assumption of Revolutionary War debts, building the transcontinental railroad, passage of tariff laws, passage of the Interstate Commerce Act, creation of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, adoption of the Social Security system, passage of federal minimum wage laws, Reagan Era tax cuts, and ratification of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA).

You are not limited to these suggestions.

Guidelines:

In your essay, be sure to:

- · Develop all aspects of the task
- · Support the theme with relevant facts, examples, and details
- Use a logical and clear plan of organization, including an introduction and a conclusion that are beyond a simple restatement of the theme

In developing your answer to Part II, be sure to keep this general definition in mind:

discuss means "to make observations about something using facts, reasoning, and argument; to present in some detail"

AP Essay Question:

Describe and account for the rise of nativism in American Society from 1900 to 1930

From 1900 to 1930, nativism rose in American society at a great rate. This was caused by immigration and disillustrenment from the Great war and can be seen in the resurrection of th Kuklux Klan and the National origins Act. Immigration had been on the rise since before the Civil War when Irish and German immigrants came in large numbers. Like the opposition then to Catholics by the Knew Nothings and the labor problems caused by the influx of Irish, the early twentieth century evoked great backlash from natives. Thesenew immigrants were not from Western Europe, but increasingly came from Eastern Europe and a large numbers of Jews came to an anti-Semitic America. New immigrants tended to congregate insums that many Progressive politicians were trying to clear. Also, because these immigrants were willing towark for law mages, blucklar workers resented them.



Welcome To Our Author's Celebration




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Prewriting: This is where we brainstorm our ideas about our story and put them in a web.





Sharing: When our book is finished we are ready to share our book with an audience. That is why we are here today to celebrate all our hard work we have put into making our
