Groundbreaking

What a wonderful Groundbreaking Ceremony on October 18. Thank you to the community, the Mayor and our Tigers for taking part in the Groundbreaking Ceremony. The excitement for our Multipurpose Athletic Complex is growing! The facility is over 12,000 square feet and will connect to our existing building. The back hallway of the gym near the locker rooms will connect to our new facility. The target completion date is mid-August. This is an exciting time for our students, district and community!

The Multi-Purpose Athletic Facility is led by Beaver Construction and Lesko Architects as well as local community partners to complete the project. It is important that all of our stakeholders are part of the vision to enhance and grow our district. We welcome input and feedback as we continue to promote our current facilities and look to align our vision for the future. We thank our community partners for supporting the initial phase to enhance opportunities for students.

The cost of the building is around \$2.8 million to be paid through ESSER (Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief) funds and General Fund money through a lease to ensure fiscal responsibility. The Multi-Purpose Athletic Facility will include a two lane walking track, basketball court that includes six hoops, volleyball set up with full length and two side setups, baseball/softball batting cages, a weight room and storage area.

The Multi-Purpose Athletic Facility will be used throughout the school for educational needs, active play and learning. After school the Multi-Purpose Athletic Facility will allow for all athletic and extracurricular groups to have more space for training and practice. The Multi-Purpose Athletic Facility will also allow more collaboration with our youth programs and community to allow after school access.






Girls on the Run
