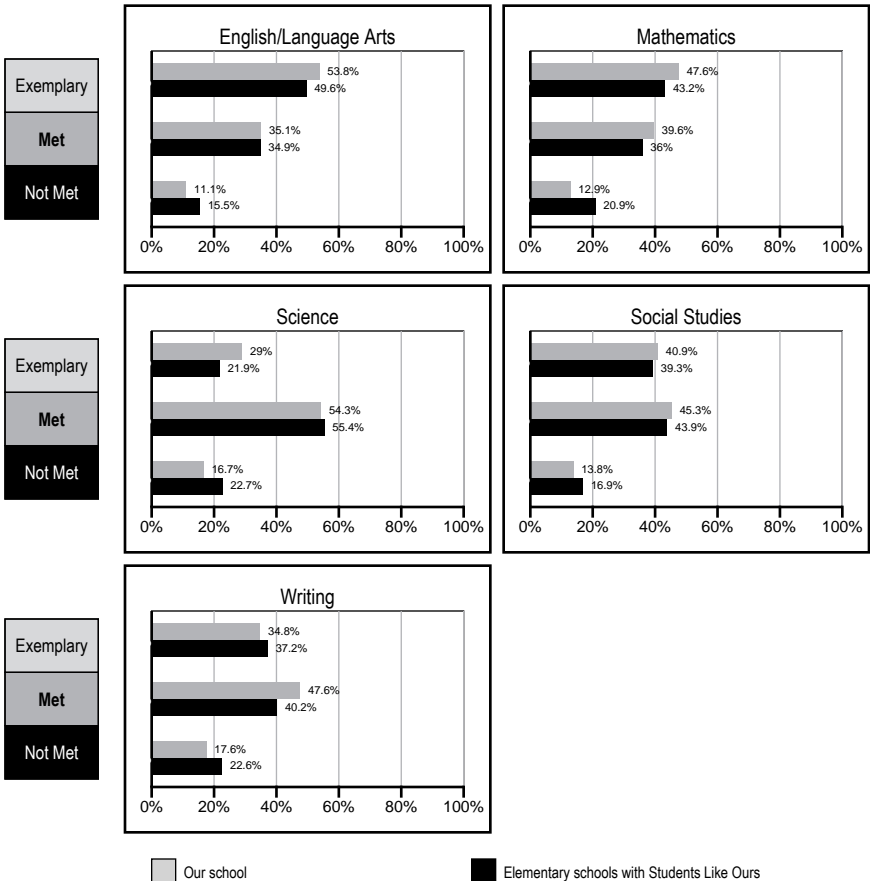

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Parents, Community, and All Delmae Stakeholders,

Delmae Heights Elementary School prides itself on being a school where “Kids and Character Count”! Our staff strives for academic excellence for all students through a program of instructional excellence which includes both staff development for teachers and classroom instruction for students.

Our school wide instructional emphasis includes, differentiated instruction based on data, inclusion of supplemental instructional programs to include Reading Renaissance, Accelerated Math, Math Out of the Box, Everyday Calendar Counts Math, Science Foss Kits, Literacy Workstations, Thinking Maps and an increase use of technology to enhance instruction. Four of our teachers are National Board certified and we have had five finalists in the District’s Teacher of the Year Program.

These effective instructional programs along with dedicated staff high expectations for students has resulted in Delmae

being the recipient of six Palmetto Silver Awards, a second time recipient of an FSD1 School Foundation Grant for

technology, inclusion in NNPS’s Promising Practices Publication and being the recipient of an Emerging School of Character Award.

Our school-wide character emphasis includes a school wide Character Curriculum (Character Counts).

Students are also involved in many service projects throughout the year that provide opportunities to support local and national organizations such as Harvest Hope and Operation Christmas Child.

Our SIC and APT parent groups plan and carry out meetings, address concerns and issues that affect our

school, sponsor fundraisers and other school events which build a sense of family and raise monies for educational, recreational, and beautification projects at our school. We are also a member of NNPS (National Network of Partnership Schools) and sponsor four Title One Family Nights each year.

Community and business partnerships also play a role in our school. Our school is a part of the district’s Faith-Based Volunteer Initiative. In addition, our APT volunteers, monthly Pro Dads Breakfast and Helping Hands Programs provide additional opportunities for parent and community involvement.

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
