One of the reasons why we believe Los Altos High School is a great place to be is that we create well-rounded students. We strive to maintain all of the different opportunities to make students leave here with life skills for their future endeavors. We are proud of our Academics, Performing Arts, Career Technical Education, AVID, Leadership Programs, and our Athletic Programs. These are some of the most successful programs in Southern California and beyond.

We are also in our third year of the AP Capstone Program. AP Capstone was an opportunity we applied for last year, and we were accepted as one of the few schools in the San Gabriel Valley to have an AP Capstone Diploma Program.

The remainder of this document will give you insight to some of those accomplishments in what are very prestigious programs.

Academics:

Year after year we are ranked in the US news for high schools. In 2022, we were a silver ranked school.

Our longtime Economics Teacher, Jibin Park, has always challenged his students to participate in competitions. He is also our Academic Decathlon Teacher. See some of the students accomplishments below:

- In the past, we've entered students in the National Economics Challenge and Personal Finance Challenge at the Los Angeles Branch of the Federal Reserve Bank.
- From 2015 – 2019, we have participated in the Economics and Personal Finance Olympiad at Cal State Fullerton. In 2015 and 2019, we placed 2nd. From 2016-2018, we placed first. Every year, students compete in the Stock Market Game on www.stockmarketgame.org, and in the Fall 2020, one student (Samantha Cabrera) won first place with a portfolio that returned over 30% in less than three months.
- For Academic Decathlon, Los Altos has been the highest scoring school within our district since 2006.
- Teacher Jibin Park was awarded the California Association of School Economics Teachers (CASET) Teacher of the Year in 2016, and named one of the California Council on Economic Education (CCEE) Teacher of the Year in 2019.

- Christine Castro (Class of 2022) was a 7th place national winner in the high school division for Spring 2022 (and 1st place state winner), and received a \$100 award. Christine wrote an essay explaining what companies would thrive in the future.

Digital Graphics [Teacher: Jasey Crowl]

Mr. Crowl has build our Digital Graphics pathway into one of the strongest pathways in the San Gabriel Valley with students learning skills of today's world.

Business [Teacher: Jason Gervais]

- 6 of our Girls Build students attended a half day in Hawthorne at the SpaceX campus. They were able to meet and shared one on one time with women engineers at SpaceX. They also received a personal tour of the factory building floor. They saw so many things, only a few highlights are: seeing rocket engines being built, the shell of the rocket they learned is only 1/4 of an inch thick and fit together like stacking soda cans on top of each other. The ability to see a 3D printer that prints in titanium, stainless steel, and some other exotic materials. They ended the day with lunch and a panel discussion where the lady engineers shared their journey, their education, hobbies and how they overcame entry barriers into a field that is historically male dominate.
- 100 of our Conqueror ladies attended a two-day event called **"Girls Build"** which exposes women to careers in the S.T.E.A.M. fields of work. It also helps to empower these women to solve issues in their community using S.T.E.A.M.
- We had three students place at the regional FBLA competition. We would have gone further, however our season was cut short do to the pandemic.
- We had two consecutive days of training with our Microsoft Corporate partners where they came and taught our classes advanced features on Microsoft Teams, OneNote, and Word.
- Four of my five Business classes went to the Microsoft store to have a full day of training and competition around a S.T.E.A.M. activity (programing a computer, building and app etc....) which concluded with some employees from Microsoft corporate office who flew in for the sole purpose of speaking with our students. We had people from the Marketing team; the Human Resource team, Sales, and Engineering Team come and talk with our students. We would have had all five classes go however it was cut short due to the pandemic.
- At Christmas time, we donated gifts to HLPUSD families in need so that we could provide them with a great Christmas. We raised funds in each of my classes 2-\$300 the students picked out the gifts, we purchased, wrapped and delivered them to the districts resource center and then they passed them on to the families.
- We had 15 students participate at LA Metro for their summer internship program. It was virtual, however it was still a great event though it was not the usual program

they would participate in. One of my students Daisy Villa was the team leader of one of the groups. They placed first in their division and second overall.

- All of the students in our finance classes created their own resume portfolio. We cover a lot when we do the resume part of the year, it concludes however with a mock interview where they interview for a mock job with people from LA Metro, Microsoft, and a couple of people from HLPUSD.

AVID [Teacher: Barbara Crowther]:

The Los Altos High School AVID Program began in 2009 with just one class of 33 students and has now grown to have two classes at every grade level amounting to over 200 students. Our annual AVID Certification level is "Emerging School-Wide". We are so proud of our AVID students for challenging themselves to make a better future and they contribute greatly to the community of Los Altos and beyond.

- Our eight graduating classes have a 98% acceptance rate into 4 year colleges/universities. The Class of 2015 and 2019 had 100% accepted.
- Overall approximately 85% of our students are first-generation college bound, and 88% qualify for free/reduced lunch (prior to the whole school qualifying), and a few are DACA/undocumented.
- Each year 100% of the seniors take the SAT, submit at least one application to a 4 year school, and submit the FAFSA.
- 100% of our students have attended a 2 year community college, 4 year college/university, or enlisted full time in the military for at least their first year after leaving LAHS.
- We had a 2014 Dell Scholarship recipient (\$20,000) and a Dell Scholarship Finalist in 2020.
- We had a Posse Scholarship finalist in 2020.
- We have had two recipients of the Dreamers Scholarship.
