

# **Profile Data 2019-2020**

### **THE COMMUNITY AND SCHOOL**

Glen A. Wilson High School is a four-year comprehensive public high school, located twenty-five miles east of Los Angeles serving a suburban middle class community of approximately 54,000 residents. Median income is \$50, 000. Wilson has accreditation from the Western Association of Schools and Colleges and is a member of the International Baccalaureate Organization. The school maintains a traditional calendar with two 19-week semesters where each class meets daily. Six periods are required for grades 9-11 with an optional, but limited, zero period. Seniors are allowed a five period day if all district criteria are met. Wilson has a long history of quality education balanced with participation in extracurricular activities such as Athletics, Visual and Performing Art groups, Mock Trial, FBLA, Science Olympiad, Robotics and Associated Student Body, just to highlight a few. There are a total of 42 chartered active clubs and a comprehensive interscholastic athletic program for students in a total of 15 different sports.

The racial/ethnic composition has remained consistent for the past few years of roughly 41% Asian, 51% Hispanic, 1% African American, 5% Caucasian and 2% other.

# **THE FACULTY**

The 2020-21 faculty consists of a principal, 3 assistant principals, 4 full time counselors, and 59 teachers. Fifty-one percent of our staff hold a Master's Degree or above. The school also has 1 full time psychologist, 2 ELD language aides, and a Special Education coordinator.

### **COVID - 19 CHANGES**

Students earned 5 credits and a mark of CR for each enrolled class in Spring 2020. Summer classes were available in an online format for a letter grade. Fall 2020 will be completed through distance learning in a block schedule modality and letter grades will be earned. Platforms are primarily Zoom and Canvas.

Students have over 150 courses from which to choose. College preparatory subjects are emphasized but there are a variety of offerings serving the diversified needs of students. LOTE options include Spanish, Chinese and Korean. VAPA areas consist of Vocal and Instrumental Music, Fine and Digital Art, as well as Theater. CTE classes include fields such as Business, Culinary Arts, Computer Science, Engineering, and Biomedical Science, the later of two in partnership with Project Lead the Way. Our International Baccalaureate program is in its 20<sup>th</sup> year, and our AVID program is in its 14<sup>th</sup> year.

### **GRADE DISTRIBUTION**

All letter grades are included in the computation of the cumulative GPA (A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0). Honors, Advanced Placement, and International Baccalaureate classes are weighted in the calculation of the average, with one extra grade point awarded for marks of C- and higher. Both weighted and non-weighted total GPA's are listed on the transcript.

#### ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

Wilson High School currently offers 21 AP courses for the 2020-21 school year, consistent with last year. 33% of our students took at least one Advanced Placement test in 2019. The total number of AP exams taken in 2018-19\* was 1,054 with a passing rate of 73.3%.

<u>7</u> juniors and <u>12</u> seniors participated in the International Baccalaureate program. 7 of the 12 seniors received their IB Diploma. In addition to Diploma candidates, Wilson also had 42 Certificate candidates in IB classes of English HL, Chinese SL, Spanish SL and Biology HL. Most of Wilson's Standard Level (SL) IB courses are contained within the AP counterpart; the following SL or HL courses are stand-alone IB classes:

#### **COLLEGE TEST INFORMATION**

In support of our commitment to college and career readiness for all students, Wilson High School has provided, free of charge, the PSAT to all  $10^{\rm th}$  graders since 2014 and the PSAT 9 to all  $9^{\rm th}$  graders since 2016. Beginning with the 2018-19 school year, all  $11^{\rm th}$  and  $12^{\rm th}$  graders were provided the SAT during the school day in the month of October. Students in grade 11 were able to opt to take the PSAT instead, but all  $12^{\rm th}$  graders were required to take the SAT.
