Kevin Bowman, President, called the meeting to order. Mike Keaffaber, Superintendent, Chris Kuhn, Assistant Superintendent, and Tim Drake, Chief Academic Officer were present. Matt Driscoll shared that Garmann Miller gave a presentation on projects that are needed at the facility.

Superintendent's Report:

Mr. Keaffaber presented an update on the 123rd General Assembly Legislative Session. There are many bills that pertain to schools and education.

- 1,162 bills introduced
- 223 bills on the ISBA tracing list
- 252 new laws 19% or 48 new K-12 education policy, school or local governance, or child-related laws.
- Adding 48 results in 233 new laws in the last 6 years.

He turned it over to Dr. Kuhn who shared that legislation did increase budget support. MSD will receive a 5.2% increase the first year and 1.8% the second year as long as the ADM stays the same. They will be eliminating textbook rental fees, there will continue to be two count days but the second one will occur about three weeks later than normal.

Curriculum Report:

Mr. Drake reported the science curriculum discussions are on hold for now. Students are continuing to test for iLearn.
