Weather Watcher

Go outside and observe the weather each day. Be sure to tell your parents what you observed. Give your parents suggestions on what they should wear that day. Using a calendar record what you see each day.

<u>Texture Rubbings</u>

How many objects of different textures can you find?

Use crayons and a blank piece of paper to complete a texture rubbing.

Can your family guess what it is?

Examples; rocks, bark, leaves, roots, grass, etc.

Act it Out!

Pretend you are a seed. Show your family how you grow and what you need to be able to grow. Challenge: Can you add music to create a performance?

<u>Paint/Draw/color a</u> <u>Picture of your</u> favorite animal

Make sure you use details and label the parts of the animal.

Built it

Build an airplane out of two different materials. Measure how far they go using standard or nonstandard units of measurements. Describe how they move and the force that was applied.

Storytime Lego Building Challenge

Bring books to life through legos. Can you rebuild the book you read using legos. Then retell the story to a family member using your creation.

<u>Plastic Egg</u> Submarine

- Fill plastic Easter Eggs with different objects.
- Place the eggs in a bucket or tub of water and see if they sink or float.
- Draw your observations in a chart that sorts the objects that float and sink.
