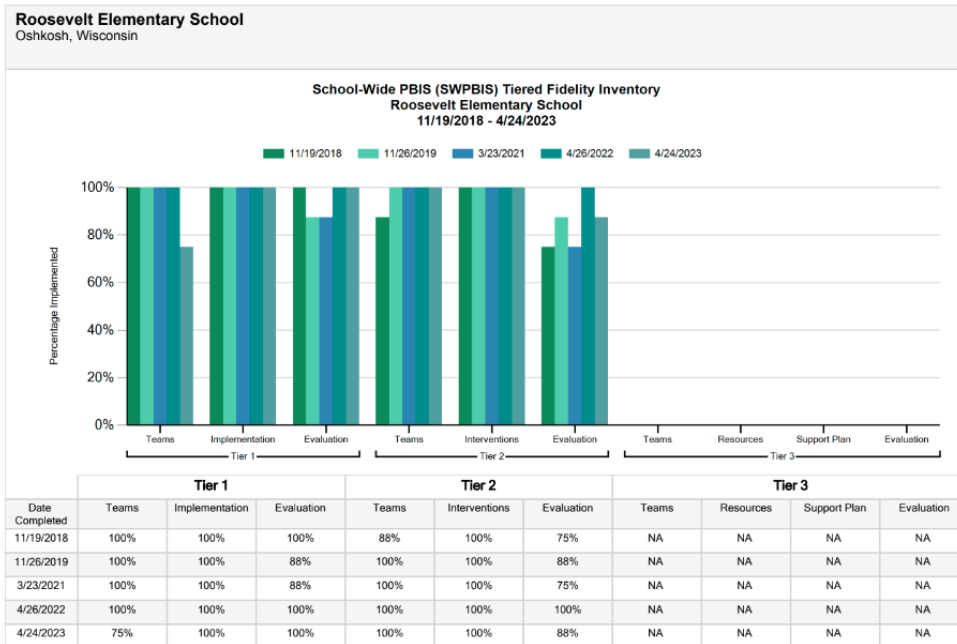

### School Wide (Tier 1) Data

Below is our school wide PBIS data from 2018 to 2023. It includes our committees, implementation across the school, and fidelity and effectiveness of tier 1 practices. We remain committed to communicating our goals and practices with families. We survey families twice a year at family nights. Between 97-98% of families know our school practices. Our goal for next year is to boost our understanding of beep bucks.



### Family Night Survey Results

**98%** of families know about the **Roosevelt Way**

**73%** of families know about **Beep Bucks**

**97%** said yes, their child receives positive reinforcement for expected behavior

**97%** of families identify **Be Respectful, Be Responsible, Be Safe** as the behavior focus

## Staying Calm This Summer

Summer is full of fun times, but with so much to do, things can be a bit stressful at times. Here are some ideas for maintaining a calm household:

- Seeing game: Spend 1 minute looking around without talking. Find things you have not noticed before. At the end of the minute, share the most interesting item you spotted.
- Create a quiet corner in your home. Consider putting items in the corner that appeal to different senses. Blankets, pillows, aromatherapy, music, and pictures are a few suggestions. Consider what smells, sounds, and textures appeal to your child.
- Scavenger hunt walk: Make a list of things for your child to find around the yard or neighborhood and take a walk to see how many they can find. Exercise is a great way to create calm.
- Make a gratitude jar. Each day, ask your child to think of two or three things they are thankful for. Write them on a piece of paper and put them in a container. When your child needs a calming activity, pull out the papers to read and remember all we are grateful for.

All students participated in an end of the year sidewalk chalk celebration outside of our school! Classes joined their buddy class and decorated the sidewalks. Students were also able to turn in their raffle tickets in order to win some prizes. It was the perfect way to celebrate all our students' hard work throughout the year!

## Summer Safety

We want everyone to enjoy a safe summer. Here are some reminders for parents and students:

- ★ **biking**- be safe when riding your bike by wearing equipment such as a helmet and pads, ride in the



bike lanes or on the sidewalks, one person on a bike, walk bikes across the street

- ★ **hiking**- wear appropriate clothing for the weather, walk with a partner or group, take along water, carry a cell phone if possible, use sunscreen and insect repellent
- ★ **swimming**- swim with an adult present, wear a life jacket if the water is deep, use sunscreen, no jumping or diving in shallow water, walk when in pool areas to avoid slipping
- ★ **fireworks**- have adults light the fireworks, keep your distance, have a bucket of water nearby, do not play with any kind of fire
- ★ **heat**- keep cool by drinking water and staying in the shade, check on neighbors who might need help, make sure pets do not get too hot
- ★ **other**- always wear a seatbelt, wear a lifejacket while boating or swimming in a lake
