The MLB playoffs started off with a huge bang with one-game Wild-Card games. ## What is the Winchester Mystery House?

Right turn. Faster this time, run quicker. Finally a door. Turn the knob. Open it and you see a brick wall in its place. Turn back and find a flight of stairs. Walk up and you see they lead to a ceiling. Turn back for another way out. One last door. Time to try your luck. Rush through it. You fall 4 stories to the floor outside. You lose.

Now what brilliant game is this and how soon can it be bought? Sorry gents, this isn't a game but an actual house. Yes sir, the Winchester Mystery House is a true marvel to behold and stands to be the ultimate testament to Victorian style craftsmanship: 160 rooms (two ballrooms included), 47 fireplaces, 10,000 window panes, 17 chimneys, 2 basements, and 3 elevators.
