Ms. Whitaker: Sharing information about the Black Scholars RISE program, they meet twice a month on Mondays from 3:15-4:15. They meet with 100 black men as mentors, workshops for ex. conflict resolution. Parent and staff workshops are also coming as well. Managing emotion, sharing goals, making, keeping friends conflict resolution.

Anderson, Twain and FDR will be coming to Rogers on Feb 24 Hidden Figures Event. Rogers students will serve as mentors to our elementary students.

Ms. Martinez: Safety and Risk Manager for LESD. Goal-invest in optimal learning environments that enhance student learning and ensure safety. Annual assessment for school climate data. 6 out of 8 schools improved from prior year. Disaster Drills (great shake out, fire drills alarms get tested monthly, natural or man-made disaster & lockdown/lockout). Lock out = DANGER IS OUTSIDE Lockdown = DANGER INSIDE.

Q: Ms. Thomas - The water on site--are those expired?

A: Ms. Martinez - There will be a replacement/ replenishment.

Updates: Raptor Visitor system, New bleeding control kits and IP clock system have been given to every school site. New emergency backpacks and emergency flip charts will be given to every school site.

Q: Ms. Clarke - Is there anything in place for fentanyl poisoning (Narcan)?

A: Ms. Martinez - No update yet but I will look into that.

Q: Ms. Clarke - Door blockers, will there be any updates with having the door blocker be pulled down instead of reaching your hand outside?

A: Ms. Martinez - It is in the works and will be checking in with Ms. Gonzalez (Director of Student Support Services).

Q: Ms. Zeb - Will there be a safety committee for COVID/ issues that are happening throughout the site?

A: Ms. Martinez - I will be bringing it back, it is in the works.

Q: Ms. Tapia - Are there any workshops/safety measures for lockdown/lockout for students & staff?

A: Ms. Martinez - Yes there are, we are in communication with law enforcement and will be talking to staff soon and then students.

Members approved the CSSP document.

Ms. Soto - Information about DPAC/ DELAC. DPAC Wednesday Feb 8th 9am - 10am. Wed, Feb 22nd 9am-10am. Is there anyone that would like to share the highlights of DPAC/ DELAC?

Ms. Ong: Yes they are using practice tests for ELPAC, parents can go online and practice for when the real test comes. They talked about CABE. The school will pay for 2 parents to attend. If parents want to attend they need to be approved by SSC/ELAC. The committee also talked about volunteer opportunities.

Ms. Soto-Reese: ELPAC group testing 2/14-2/24 listening, reading and writing. One on one testing will take place 3/6-3/10 speaking (students will be called to be paired with a test proctor). There are online resources for ELPAC testing. Sample test questions, getting familiar with questions format, & content are on www.ELPAC.org. ELPAC assessment information has been sent to parents of EL students. 3 bilingual IA's they support students across contents. 2 Spanish and 1 Vietnamese. Get

Curriculum is specifically for newcomer students.</p> <p>Q: Ms. Ong - My son was placed on ELD, how can we differentiate the students that have a delayed speech and the students where English is not their first language?</p> <p>A: Ms. Soto - Thank you for your feedback. We administer the iReady diagnostic and we look at different data points. We look at student conversations when they are working. When they are in partners or groups we look at their speech. We make sure that parents are well-informed when answering the HLS survey.</p> <p>Ms. Soto - DI Program the majority of our dual immersion families come from twain.
