




#### EDUCATION IS A LIFELONG PURSUIT.

### GROWTH

- serve our current parent population by creating classroom space for siblings of current Liberty Common School students;
- appropriately steward our financial resources to also serve the growing number of parents demanding alternatives to the bereft modern educational models that characterize conventional public schools;
- help maximize junior-high and high-school academic opportunities within a smallschool culture by increasing economies of scale;
- provide increased revenue for necessary facility improvements (see 'Resources');
- promote institutional strength which allows Liberty to more effectively resist
  the erosion of the educational foundations of our society by "the rising tide of
  mediocrity that threatens our very future as a Nation and a people." National

  Educational Reform.




## STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES
