1	The response is undeveloped. It shows little understanding of narrative writing and does not include details of time or place, or a sequence of events. The writer rarely uses conventions of grammar and sentence structure correctly, and makes many mistakes in capitalization, punctuation, and spelling, which hinder the overall meaning.
0	The response does not fit the writing prompt or is incomplete.
