REPORT, SPRING 2017 STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

11.1 Assistant Superintendent Rapinchuk presented a report on OJUSD Student Achievement as measured by spring 2017 California Assessment of Student Performance & Progress (CAASPP) Assessment System. She reviewed SBAC Data: English Language Arts/Literacy & Math Two Year Trends, OJUSD compared to other K-12 Unified Districts, OJUSD School Site Comparison, OJUSD Grade Level Comparison, and OJUSD Subgroup Comparison.

She reviewed the 4 SBAC Achievement Levels, ELA and Math percentages for Stanislaus County school districts noting OJUSD had the highest percentage met or exceeded in the county with an ELA score of 47% while Hughson had 44% and the highest in the county with a Math score of 33% followed by Hughson with 31%. She noted teachers continue to work hard implementing more rigorous Math and ELA curriculum, and there is a systemic support in place to increase student learning.

REPORT ON BULLYING

11.2 Larry Mendonca, Assistant Superintendent, presented a report on Bullying, reviewing definition, intervention and enforcement, forms of bullying, bullying vs. teasing or joking, cyberbullying, what OJUSD provides for bullying prevention and intervention, prevention initiatives, prevention strategies, intervening and enforcement of bullying policy, CA Health Kids Survey results on bullying and related activities.

He noted that jurisdiction for cyberbullying can be problematic. He also noted that both he and Prevention Coordinator Armida Colon both sent out materials to teachers to get the message across, including a training PowerPoint and explicit procedure of what to do if they witness bullying, as well as presentations that are grade level appropriate. Mr. Mendonca noted we need people to report when bullying occurs, we want to give them a way to handle conflicts on their own, and the school needs to be able to enforce conduct code and policy. At the beginning of the year every staff member and student is made aware of what our expectations are if they encounter bullying and/or harassment.

Trustee Gilbert noted the prevention initiative at the elementary sites which seem to have a program, and her concern is that even though activities are noted at the junior high and high school levels, there seems to be a need for more proactive ongoing programs. Mr. Mendonca noted that in talking to ASB there are different activities that occur throughout the year. Student Board member Pabalan stated he will talk to Mr. Fowler and OHS Leadership about having something monthly.

Trustee Gilbert noted a book called "Ghost" with an antibullying message, and asked if we have curriculum of that sort. Assistant Superintendent Rapinchuk noted that book has a very powerful message, and another book the 6th grade teachers love is "Wonder". Ms. Rapinchuk said that with ELA curriculum, text at each grade level often has a theme, a big theme that naturally lends itself to conversation about how we live our lives. She also noted that teachers have ways of finding teachable moments. Student member Pabalan noted that in his AP English class they go over certain books that comment on human nature and ways humans act in society.

Trustee Gilbert asked how CA Healthy Kids Survey questions are presented to students, noting that how the question is phrased can affect the student's response. Ms. Colon believed the question as listed is similar to what students are responding to but it's phrased "within the last 12 months". Trustee Shatswell commented that she was surprised that social media bullying was not higher than being pushed. Student member Pabalan remembered taking the survey and being confused about the question because as a basketball player he gets hit or pushed in practice, and suggested the inclusion of the phrase "with bad intent" could be added to clarify. Superintendent Malone noted that we don't control the CA Healthy Kids Survey Language so we cannot modify the questions. Board President Shook noted that they have refined the survey because the questions used to be much broader.

Mr. Mendonca reviewed survey results that generally students feel pretty safe at school, schools help students solve conflicts with one another, teach students to feel responsible for how they act, teach students to care about each other and treat each other with respect, and that bullying is not allowed and will be addressed. Schools are going through a concentrated effort to address those issues and he commends site administrators and staff for working hard to address this and do everything we can to make incident numbers go down.

ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION #17-18-05, RED RIBBON WEEK

12.1 Armida Colon, Director of State and Federal Programs, presented this item proclaiming the district's Red Ribbon Week October 23-27, and requested the board waive reading of the resolution for Red Ribbon Week.

PUBLIC HEARING, PRESENT INITIAL PROPOSALS TO MODIFY OTA AGREEMENT

Assistant Superintendent Terri Taylor explained that the Board holds a public hearing tonight, Mr. Fauria gives the district OTA's initial proposal and we give him the district's initial proposal, and place at the District Office for 30 days and then commence negotiations. Public hearing opened at 7:38 p.m.

Ms. Taylor exchanged proposals to modify the OTA agreement with Marty Fauria, lead negotiator for OTA. He acknowledged negotiations team members, some of who were in the audience: Michelle Holcomb, Mike Seefeldt, Stacy Graham, Danesa Menge, Denise Springer, Jeremy Acker and himself.

PUBLIC HEARING, PRESENT INITIAL PROPOSALS TO MODIFY CSEA AGREEMENT

Public Hearing opened at 7:40 p.m. Assistant Superintendent Terri Taylor noted that CSEA is doing a successor agreement, which means the whole contract is open. Ms. Taylor exchanged proposals to modify the CSEA agreement with Adam Uplinger, CSEA President and lead negotiator.

PUBLIC HEARING, CHARTER EDUCATOR EFFECTIVENESS GRANT EXPENDITURE PLAN

12.4 Assistant Superintendent Rapinchuk presented this item for public hearing, explaining that in 2015-16 funds were granted to be used for professional development, coaching and support services within a three year period. Oakdale Charter received a total of \$5,060 and must present their expenditure plan for use of these funds, which includes attendance at the Charter Schools Conference in the spring and attendance at College Board Seminars and Webinars. The public hearing is being held tonight and they will bring the plan to the Board in November for approval.

APPROVE QUARTERLY DEVELOPER FEES REPORT

12.5 Chief Business Officer Susan Dyke presented a report on developer fees collected during the first quarter. She was happy to report we had a tremendous amount of building and collections were higher than last year; with the \$380,000 collected in this first quarter and our unspent balance, we have over \$500,000 that we can put toward facilities projects that have not been funded yet.
