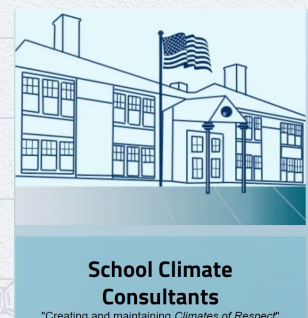
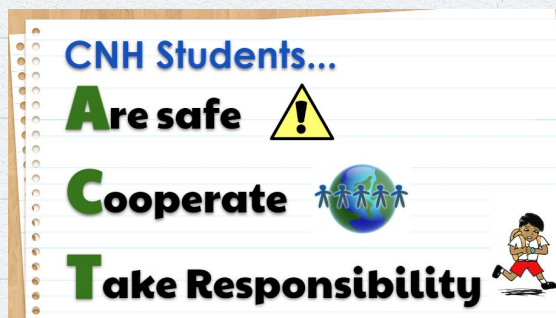
1. **L**ook/listen/and learn (Discuss with your partner)

5. **C**reate (Make your project)
6. **H**ighlight what's working and failing (Reflect)
