School Responsibilities

 - Back to School Night will be provided to give parents the opportunity to hear teachers' and school's expectations and individual conferences to meet with each parent will occur at least once yearly.
- Provide parents with frequent reports on their child's progress through Report Cards each trimester and midterm Progress Reports as needed to convey areas of need.
- Provide parents reasonable access to staff.
 - Parents will be provided with email addresses to contact teachers and administrators with questions and concerns or to make appointments for meetings.
- Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class and to observe classroom activities.
 - Room Parent and Parent Helpers will be recruited at the beginning of the school year and welcomed into the classroom by teachers.

Parent Responsibilities
