Step three will be when volunteers at the nature reserve check the traps early in the morning to see what is living along the hedgerows, weigh each animal, check it's gender and general health before releasing it. 
YEAR 8 MATHS



GOLF

The golfers have had a busy and very successful couple of weeks. With three such strong performances this meant Martin, Zane and Jack not only won the U12 Team Championships but were the best team including U13 teams by an amazing 25 shots!

The next event was held at Pyrford Lakes Golf Club where Zane, Martin, Jack, Tate and Alexander were joined by **Jamie M** to play in the ISGA Salver. Zane top scored with an 82 gross and joined forces with Martin scoring 83 to finish in second place in the team championship just one shot behind the winners.
