


What is Dual Language Immersion Programs?

Dual Language Immersion is a way to engage in academic and social emotional learning while acquiring another language at the same time.

- Students learn academic content and skills that are aligned to grade-level standards.
- Students learn language in context through authentic and purposeful usage.
- Students have equitable access to curriculum, resources, and supports.
- Students have equitable opportunities for engagement and enrichment.

Goals of Dual Language Immersion Education in ISD 622



Long-term Impact of Dual Language Immersion

By high school, students in grades 10, 11, 12 can test in reading, writing, speaking, and listening in the target language.

- MN Bilingual Seal Platinum: ACTFL Level Advanced Low
- MN Bilingual Seal Gold: ACTFL Level Intermediate High
- MN World Language Proficiency Certificate: ACTFL Level Intermediate Low

Students are awarded college credits:






Dual Language Immersion Locations

Why choose a Dual Language Immersion program?

Benefits of Language Immersion:

- Immersion students do as well or better than non-immersion students in academic subjects, including graduation and participation in higher academics (de Jong & Bearse, 2011; Thomas & Collier, 2002).
- Immersion students develop **more neural pathways in their brains** than their monolingual peers (Esposito & Baker-Ward, 2013; Ball, 2010; Espinosa,2013; Sandhofer & Uchikoshi, 2013; Barac et al., 2014).
- Immersion students can develop proficiency in other languages and are more prepared for life and work in a global economy (Tochon, 2009; Rumbaut, 2014).

Thomas & Collier Study: Achievement Comparison Graphs from North Carolina Public Schools





What is an 80/20 Language Immersion Model?


Language Usage in an Instructional 80/20 Language Immersion

First Day of Kindergarten Spanish Dual Language Immersion

Do I need to know Spanish for my child to be successful?

- Spanish immersion teachers will support the Spanish language learning needed for success at school.
- Families can reinforce the native language spoken at home (English, Spanish, or other home language).
- Families can encourage their children to practice with work sent home.

Parents/Guardians do not need to know Spanish.

Why choose a Spanish Dual Immersion program?

- There are over 270,000 Latino/Hispanics in Minnesota, over 40 million in the USA, and over 450 million worldwide. (Babbel.com)
- Spanish immersion students will gain rich knowledge of Spanish-speaking language and cultures.
- Spanish immersion students will develop **speaking**, **listening**, **reading**, **and writing skills in Spanish and English**.
- Spanish immersion students will be prepared for **local and** global competitiveness in their futures.

Who can enroll in the Spanish Immersion Program?

- Any child who will turn **5 years old before September 1, 2023** can enroll in the Spanish Immersion Kindergarten class.
- There are <u>no attendance boundaries</u> for Spanish Immersion student enrollment - you can live anywhere in-the-district or out-of-district.
 - In-the-district: District transportation will be provided, if needed.
 - Out-of-district: You must provide your own transportation.

Early Childhood Screening

A FREE screening includes:

- Vision & Hearing
- Large/Fine Motor Skills
- Thinking, Language & Communication Skills
- Social-Emotional Growth
- Height & Weight
- Immunizations/Health History

State law requires screening between ages 3-5, before kindergarten. If your child was already screened at age 3, for District 622 Preschool, or Head Start, you don't need another screening.

Social/Self Help Skills To Work On...

- Using the bathroom independently
- Dressing independently (including buttons, zippers, belts, etc.)
- Vocalizing needs and is able to report a problem to an adult
- Following 2-3 step directions
- Eating meals independently, such as opening packages
- Putting shoes on independently
- Working on a quiet activity, independently, for at least 10 minutes (coloring, puzzles, painting, looking at books, etc.)
- Taking turns and shares with others (slide at the park, toys with friends, games, etc)



Academic Skills to Work On...

- Listening to books read by an adult, in any language, on a regular basis
- Understanding how a book works (holding a book, turning pages, etc.)
- Recognizing their first name
- Identifying the letters in their name and at least half of the letters in the alphabet
- Holding a writing utensil with a three-point grasp
- Working on writing their name starting with an uppercase letter followed by lowercase letters
- Holding a scissors and ability to control them when cutting paper
- Recognizing numbers 1-10 and practicing counting (with and without objects)
