Getting Started with your Chromebook

- Login to your Chromebook
 - Students will log in with their 9-digit Student ID (e.g. 9812341234@aps.edu).
 - Click Next and enter your password (please contact servicedesk@aps.edu for help with your student password)
- You can adjust your settings, access Google for Education, or visit the World Wide Web with the Chrome browser
- To log out of your Chromebook, click the status box on the lower right corner and select "Sign Out" (may look different in different Chromebook hardware devices).



Things To Do With Your Chromebook Today

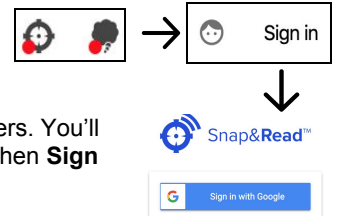
Build infographics in **Google Drawings** and share your learning in **Google Docs**; Use a collaborative **Google Slides** presentation deck for digital storytelling; Use **Screencastify** to capture your digital story into a movie; Use **Google Docs** for daily journal entries; Use **Google Maps** with google sheets to create a road trip across the states; Collaborate on units and assignments using collaborative **Google Docs** or **Slides**; Communicate and collaborate using **Google Chat** or **Meet**; Translate information using **Google Translate**; Use Voice Recognition in **Google Docs** for journaling and assignments; Connect with your classmates in using **Google Drive** (folder), **Google Classroom**, and/or **Sites**.

Chrome Browser Tools

Every Chromebook in APS has accessibility tools such as text to speech, dynamic text leveler, language translation, color overlay with reading line guides, picture supported dictionary, outlines, word prediction, and speech recognition. Tools such as *Co:writer*, *Snap&Read* and *Wordbank* automatically install for ALL APS users. You'll need to **sign in to one of these tools** on your Chromebook by **clicking the icons** (see images to the right), then **Sign in**, and **click the blue Sign in with Google button(s)**. Logging in to one app will log you in to all of them.



So...what is a Chromebook?

It's a laptop that runs on the Google Chrome operating system. The Chrome operating system is designed to work on the cloud, so that means everything—your files, your apps, even your desktop—lives online (not on your laptop) and is the same wherever you sign in (all content is auto-saved real-time). No wifi? Chromebooks also store files locally and work offline. Scan the QR code to the right for the Google Distance Learning Hub for more online resources to use with your Chromebook.
