

A note about Math and Science courses:

- Next level appropriate Math courses will be added to each student's course requests. This course recommendation will be determined by using assessment data, current performance in your math course, and teacher's individual knowledge of each student.
- If a family wishes to request a math course different from the one recommended, they must sign a form indicating this request and return the form to the counseling office. Forms may be obtained from the student's math teacher.
- Many Science courses have Math learning recommendations. It is important to choose a Science course appropriate for your level of Math knowledge. Please check the course guide for learning recs prior to making your choices!
- When choosing your alternate courses, please choose one alternate Science! It is not always possible for students to receive their first choice of Science based on demand, seniority, and Math levels.



Using Student Access in Skyward




