

RESULTS THAT MATTER

46% of F1S students scored Met or Exceed in ELA in 2022.

31% of F1S students scored Met or Exceeds in Math in 2022

F1S had more students score Met/Exceeds in ELA in 2022 than in 2019 (pre-covid). We saw our largest growth points in 4th and 5th grade.

Our math scores have not recovered from the COVID era. We are below where we were in 2019, especially in 4th and 6th grade.

Our middle school numbers in both ELA and Math are about the same as they were in 2019 pre-covid.

Royall, DLC, Briggs, Greenwood and North Vista showed considerable ELA improvement from 2019 - 2022.

Savannah Grove, Royall, Briggs and DLC also showed growth in Math from 2019-2022

Royall's Grade 5 increased in reading and math by more than 30% from 2021- 2022.

F1S saw growth in all areas and all grades from 2021-2022, except 6th grade stayed the same. Our largest growth was in 3rd and 5th grade in both ELA and Math by a little more than 10%.

Royall Top performer with 3/4 of their ELA students and over half of their math students scoring Met/Exceeds.


