Call to order: 6:05pm, Roxanne Overby, Vice President (Elizabeth Jones, President, unable to attend)

Vice President, Roxanne Overby

February meeting minutes approved unanimously electronically

Principal, Mrs. Lamm

- · Plan for lost and found items
 - PTO volunteer can come in and organize lost and found items before March Math Night when parents will be in the building so hopefully some of the items will be claimed
- Need volunteers for picture day Thursday, March 9th @ 8:30am (until approx. noon)

- Field trip planned for 3rd graders?
 - Virginia Living Museum field trip is being planned for April timeframe (note this is a tentative location/timeframe - more details to come)
- Math Night
 - Thursday, 3/23/23 → 5:30-7:00pm @ PES
 - 5:30-6:00 = dinner in PES Cafeteria
 - 6:00 7:00 = math games in each grade level pod
 - Students will have math games by grade levels that are being prepared by grade-level teacher teams (i.e. - life size board game / "math pong" / cupcake walk / etc.)
 - Table can be set up to sell PTO swag (new P shirts / stuffed bulls / socks / bracelets / etc.)
 - PTO is providing dinner for this event consider selling 'meal deals' as a fundraiser
 - Chick-Fil-A sandwich costs \$4.99
 - Consider selling sandwich + bottle water OR Capri Sun + bag of chips as a 'meal deal' at a cost of \$6 or higher
- Spring Book Fair is scheduled for April 17th April 21st → Family Night is April 20th

Treasurer, Erika Chwalik (unable to attend)

- Reviewed and discussed electronic Treasurer's Report
 - 2nd teacher allotment check will be delivered to PES soon
 - o If we plan to fund the rest of the budget items for the remainder of the school year, there will be a \$2,346.25 shortage. Discussed plans to cover the shortage and noted we expect to recover much of it through swag sales. Expense for swag has been incurred; however, no opportunities for sales to date first opportunity will be Math Night and depending on amount of inventory leftover, will consider other venues for sales throughout the school / community

- Roxanne suggested setting up 'PTBoard' for PES PTO.
 - PTBoard can be used for announcements, signups, swag / meal sales (i.e. credit card processing), etc.
 - PPS PTO has been using all year and it has been a huge success
 - All in attendance were in favor of Roxanne moving forward with set up for PES PTO as the first year of service is free (future years can continue to be free with referral codes)
 - Roxanne will plan to set up before Math Night so it can be used for easy sales of 'meal deals' and swag at that event

Fundraising and Spirit Nights, Jenny Defendeifer

- The Fundraising Company (sneaker fundraiser)
 - We are ~½ way to our goal of 700 sneakers. Approx. 350 usable sneakers are in hand.
 - Flyer was made and will be distributed to PES students flyer reiterates these shoes are NOT being recycled (so cannot be torn / have holes / be dirty). Will start pushing for donation of new shoes as well as "gently used condition" (do not have to be expensive new shoes)
 - Any size adult or child accepted.
 - Will advertise to bring shoe donations to Bean's Spirit Night in March (much success with collections there at the Fall Spirit Night)
 - Discussed consideration of promoting on Poquoson 411 before Bean's Spirit Night to better engage the community with the effort. Determined current preference is for students' families to share on Facebook to promote to direct family and friends.

Color Run

- Saturday, April 15th → 4-6pm (3:30-4pm registration) at PES (behind school in the field)
- This is a combined event for both PPS and PES
- PPS students will run first and PES students will go to games stations and then switch
- Company will provide packets (being mailed to PES address) to send home for students
- Plan for the fundraiser to officially kick off March 10th.
- Fundraising envelopes will be due March 24th.
- PES swag table will be setup at the event to sell swag items and PTBoard should be of significant help to allow for easy credit card transactions on site
- Still in need of hot dogs, possibly from Farm Fresh, and cookies, possibly from Costco, to offer at the event

- Playground discussion
 - There is interest in researching how to obtain a new and improved playground at PES
 - King Swings Play was contacted for a quote / drawing for an ADA compliant elementary playground to obtain a price point for beginning discussions. That quote was \$17,690.92 (NOT including the cost, if any, for surfacing)
 - Discussed it does seem the PES PTO could successfully assist with a fundraising effort to raise sufficient funds for this project if an approved vendor and approved playground plan can be obtained from the School Board and / or other appropriate channels
