Good Evening HSMC Family!

Thank you for continuing along with us on our 2020-2021 school-year journey. It continues to be our intention to keep you updated via weekly news updates, school website postings and updates to our social media. In each of these updates I will provide the most recent information related to our COVID19 response. At this point, cases have been consistently declining across Ventura County and while our county indicator remains in "the purple," it appears as though we will soon be "in the red."

We will be returning to a blended schedule for those who indicated that as their preference on our most recent survey beginning on Monday, April 5. For those families who have chosen to remain distance-only, nothing will change for your student and they will complete the school year with the same schedule they have had so far this semester. We will be holding mandatory information sessions in late March to explain all of the pertinent details for your student's return (either distance or blended).

If you have chosen "blended," the days your student will be assigned to be in-person will be dependent on the final results of this survey, school-wide. Our plans will be developed based on the number of responses in each category. The most likely outcome is that a blended student will attend classes in person 2 days per week and at a distance 3 days per week. How this information will specifically relate to your student will be explained in the late-March mandatory meeting.



The Ventura County Chapter of the A Open with Works Association (APWA) is pleased to announce the availability of scholarships for high school students entering college or university in an engineering/public works related major from any high school located within the APWA Ventura Chapter membership region. The region includes cities of Agoura Hills, Camarillo, Calabasas, Fillmore, Moorpark, Ojai, Oxnard, Port Hueneme, Santa Paula, Simi Valley, Thousand Oaks, Ventura, Westlake Village, and County unincorporated areas.

Applicants must be a 12th grade student and/or graduating high school in the spring or summer of 2021, and who will be attending college or university in the fall of 2021, and will be pursuing studies in a public works related field of study. To be eligible for consideration for a scholarship, the applicant must complete and submit the application form posted on http://ventura.apwa.net/MenuHomepage/1066/Scholarships and other required documents listed in page 2 of the application.

- PLEASE DO NOT JUST "DROP BY" THE HSMC CAMPUS. Our office is closed unless you have an appointment. Please call or email Ms. Gaeta to schedule a time to meet on campus. Visitors will now be required to go through checkpoints at the College even if they are just picking up/dropping off. The closest checkpoint will be by the Child Development Center on Campus Dr, just past the turn they would normally take to get to HS@MC. They will need to have the VCCCD app downloaded on their smartphone and select "visitor" in order to take the pre-screen survey. They will need to leave their device on the "Clear to be on campus" screen at the end of the survey and show that to the attendant at the checkpoint in order to get an all clear health pass on the app as well as a colored wristband(color will vary by day).
- Parents/Guardians MUST call us at (805)378-6312 ext. 7293 to report tardies or absences within 48 hours, 72 hours on Fridays or holidays (even students that are 18 or over, while they are attending HS@MC they are still considered a K-12 student and must have parent/guardian report for them for attendance purposes). Per District policy emails cannot be used.
