Colleges: Check out these links for valuable information

6-8TH GRADES

- Take English and Algebra I or another rigorous math course and aim for good grades.
- Take a language other than English.
- Begin your Academic Planner on californiacolleges.edu.

10TH GRADE

- Take Geometry or Algebra II.
- Take college prep English.
- Take the PSAT exam to help you prepare for the SAT or ACT and to keep you on track for college.
- Take courses from the "a-g" course list: history, English, math, laboratory science, a foreign language, and visual and performing arts.
- Update your Academic Planner on californiacolleges.edu.

11TH GRADE

- Take college prep English and advanced math: English (writing and critical reading) and Algebra II or advanced math.
- Update your Academic Planner on californiacolleges.edu.
- Register for the PSAT exam if you didn't take it in 10th grade.
- Do your best on the Smarter Balanced Summative Assessment. Your CAASPP EAP results will help determine your readiness for college-level English and math courses before attending the CSU. In a college-level course you earn credit towards a baccalaureate degree. Visit csusuccess.org/caaspp.
- Register for the AP exams in the spring. You can earn college credit if you score well on the test(s).
- Taking the CAASPP/EAP, SAT and ACT in your junior year gives you the opportunity to strengthen your skills during your senior year by enrolling in appropriate courses. Many CSU campuses require you to take the SAT/ACT by October of your senior year.

a-g^{9TH-12TH GRADES} COURSES

The California State University requires the following college preparatory pattern of classes (referred to as the "a-g" courses) for admission:

- a History and Social Science**
2 years (1 year of U.S. History and 1 year of Social Science)
- b English** 4 years required
- c Math** 3 years (4 years recommended)
- d Laboratory Science**
2 years with a lab class
- e Language Other than English**
2 years of the same language
- f Visual and Performing Arts**
1 year
- g College Preparatory Electives**
1 year of any college preparatory subject

- Parents/Guardians **MUST** call us at (805)378-6312 ext.7293 to report tardies or absences within 48 hours, 72 hours on Fridays or holidays (even students that are 18 or over, while they are attending HS@MC they are still considered a K-12 student and must have parent/guardian report for them for attendance purposes). Per District policy emails cannot be used.
- The main office at the Moorpark College campus is closed (please refrain from using (805)378-1444, it does not take voicemail) and the College is implementing visitor safety protocols. Appointments will need to be made in advance to come to our main office until safety protocols are lifted.
 - All visitors to the College campus must download the myVCCCD app in order to complete the At Home Pre-screening before coming to campus.
- Students **MUST** use their myVCCCD email account to communicate with the College & Professors at all times, anything sent via personal email addresses may not be processed. Students will need to directly communicate to their Professors when they are going to be late or absent and late/absent policies are at the discretion of each Professor, HS@MC cannot report absences for College courses, only HS@MC high school classes.
- Students can use some MC services as Dual Enrollment students, please visit the College website for more details(Health Center offers temporary mental health/stress services, Math Support can help with College math, Library offers "Ask a Librarian" virtual services, the optional \$10 Moorpark College ID **card** can be used to take the bus for free anywhere within Ventura County, etc).
