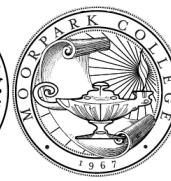
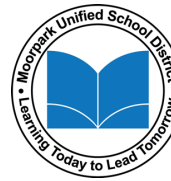

The High School at Moorpark College is a public high school serving students in 9<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup> grades. The school is a part of Moorpark Unified School District and is housed on the Moorpark College campus.

Students from over 25 different public and private schools from across Southern California come together to create a dynamic learning environment. Students take core courses at the high school level and simultaneously earn dual enrollment credit for college course work.

**Daily Schedule**

**College Courses**

Students at the High School at Moorpark College are required to register for at least one Moorpark College course during each term they are enrolled at HSMC. They are limited to no more than 11.5 college units at any given time. 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students attend cohort-based college courses that meet high school graduation requirements and meet general education requirements at Moorpark College. These courses are required to be taken by 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students. 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students choose which college courses to attend while working in consultation with both the high school and college counseling staff to ensure graduation and continued progress toward collegiate goals including Associates Degrees or CSU/UC transfer eligibility.
