APPROVAL OF PURCHASE OF CHROMEBOOKS

Assistant Superintendent, Michelle Knee, presented the request to purchase 550 chromebooks and equipment towers from CTL Corporation. The quoted price is inclusive of licenses and replacement warranties in the event of accidental damage. Equipment is estimated to cost \$163,900. The Board unanimously approved the purchase as recommended.

APPROVAL OF JOINT UCC/RPS STAFF POSITION

The School Board unanimously approved the proposal for a joint Umpqua Community College/RPS P-20 Pathways Innovator position to focus on alignment of UCC and RPS programs in the advanced manufacturing and healthcare fields. This position will be responsible for the streamlining of existing and planned pathways for students entering college and workforce.

Consider Criteria for Adding Instructional Days following District Closure Days

To provide clarity for student families and staff members, the Board discussed guidelines to follow in the event of more than three days of school closure. In addition, the Board voted not to require a make-up day for the most recent snow day, which was met with much enthusiasm by staff members in the audience.
